**1992 Columbus Clippers (New York Yankees)** (95-49) .660, (Bernie Williams, J.T. Snow, Gerald Williams, Brad Ausmus, Hensley "Bam Bam" Meulens, Torey Lovullo, Mike Humphreys, Dave Silvestri, Bob Wickman (12-5, 2.92 ERA) and prospect Sam Militello (12-2, 2.29 ERA) would lead the staff with Royal Clayton (10-5, 3.58), Russ Springer (8-5, 2.69) and swingman Andy Cook (7-5, 3.16) pitching in. The relief corps had Mike Draper (3.60 with 36 saves), and Dave Rosario (2.33

**1992 Greenville Braves (Atlanta Braves)** (100-43) .699, Manager: Grady Little

The Southern League's first 100-game winner, the 1992 Greenville Braves were led by future major leaguers Javy Lopez (.321, 16 HRs) and a young SS called up around the All-Star break named Chipper Jones. Jones would go on to hit .346, slug .594 and steal 14 bases in 67 games. Tony Tarasco (.286, 15 HRs), Mel Nieves (.283, 18 HRs) and Mike Kelly 25 HRs, 71 RBI. The Braves staff had an overall 2.64 ERA, led by Nate Minchey (13-6, 2.30, Dennis Burlingame (9-9, 3.06), Donnie Elliott (7-2, 2.08) and Mike Hostetler (6-2, 3.90) with Pat Gomez (7-0, 1.13), Kevin Coffman (6-0, 2.13) and Brian Bark (5-0, 1.15). The bullpen was also excellent with Andy Nezelek (9-2, 2.26), left-handed reliever Pedro Borbon (8-2, 3.06), Judd Johnson (6-0, 1.71), closer Don Strange (2.40, 18 saves) and Greg McMichael (4-2, 1.36)

**1993 Charlotte Knights (Cleveland Indians)** (86-55) .610, Manager: Charlie Manuel

Thirdbaseman Jim Thome (.332, 25 HRs, 102 RBI) was joined late in the season by a young Manny Ramirez (.317, 14 HRs in 40 games) before callups to the Indians. Sam Horn (.269, 38 HRs, 96 RBI and shortstop prospect Mark Lewis (.284, 17 HRs, 93 runs) also contributed heavily to the offense. The pitching staff was led by Chad Ogea (13-8, 3.81), Scott Scudder (7-7), Jason Grimsley (6-6, 3.39), Paul Byrd (7-4, 4.00), Bob Milacki (4-3, 3.39) and Jeff Mutis (6-0, 2.62). The relief corps featured Mike Christopher (3.22, 22 saves), Bill Wertz (7-2, 1.95), Jerry DiPoto (6-3, 1.93, 12 saves), and Heath Slocumb (3.56)

**1993 Harrisburg Senators (Montreal Expos)** (94-44) .681, Manager: Jim Tracy

Led by league MVP Cliff Floyd (.329, 26 HRs, 101 RBI), Rondell White (.328, .522 SLG, 21 SBs), 3B Shane Andrews (.260, 18 HRs), Glenn Murray (.253, 26 HRs, 96 RBI) and SS Chris Martin (.294, 7 HRs). The pitching staff was full of future major leaguers with Joey Eischen (14-4, 3.62), Miguel Batista (13-5, 4.34), Reid Cornelius (10-7, 4.17), Gabe White (7-2, 2.16), Ugueth Urbina (4-5, 3.99), Kirk Rueter (5-0, 1.36) and Brian Looney (3-2, 2.38). The bullpen was led by Heath Haynes (8-0, 2.59), Archie Corbin (5-3, 3.68), swingman Rafael Diaz (5-4, 3.56), Mario Brito (4-3, 2.68) and Yorkis Perez (4-2, 3.45)

**1995 Indianapolis Indians (Cincinnati Reds)** (88-56) .611, Manager: Marc Bombard

This team was filled with promising prospects who all would fail in the majors. 3B Willie Greene (.243, 19 HRs), SS Pokey Reese (.239, 10 HRs), 2B Eric Owens (.314, 492 SLG, .388 OBP) and 1B Tim Belk (.301) and Steve Gibralter (.316, 18 HRs, 63 RBI in 79 games), Keith Gordon (.264) and Chad Mottola (.259, 8 HRs) and Nigel Wilson (.313, 17 HRs in 82 games). Veteran catcher Brian Dorsett (.262, 16 HRs) and Jerry Brooks (.283, 14 HRs) made big contributions. The pitching staff had a mix of Rick Reed (11-4, 3.33), Roger Salkeld (12-2, 4.22) Matt Grott 7-3, 4.24), Travis Buckley (10-9, 4.70) and Kevin Jarvis (4-2, 4.45) The relievers were Blaine Beatty (7-1, 3.61), Scott Sullivan (4-3, 3.53), Rich Sauveur (5-2, 15 saves, 2.05), Brian Warren (2-1, 1.61), Johnny Ruffin (3-1, 2.90), Mike Remlinger (5-3, 4.05) and Scott Service (4-1, 18 saves, 2.18)

**1995 Mexico City Diablos Rojos (Red Devils) – Mexican League** (80-33-1) .708, Manager: Marco Antonio Vázquez

I came across this exceptional Mexican League team and just had to include them. The team includes former Cubs prospect Ty Gainey (.411, 27 HRs, 115 RBI in 86 games!) and several Mexican League Hall-Of-Famers like lead-off man Daniel Fernandez (.316, 89 runs), 1B Nelson "The Admiral" Barrera (.292, 71 RBI in 93 games), catcher Homar Rojas (.332, 53 RBI in 90 games) and 33-year old 3B Bernie Tatis (.303, 69 runs), Also helping out catcher Miguel Ojeda (.280) and DH Sam Horn (.316, 3 HR in 11 games). The pitching staff had future major leaguers like Francisco Cordova (13-0, 3.10), Roberto Ramirez (13-3, 2.56) and Ricardo Rincon (6-6, 5.16) plus veterans Manny Hernandez (11-4, 3.18) and Wil Flynt (7-1, 2.24)

**1995 Norfolk Tides (New York Mets)** (86-56) .606, Manager: Toby Harrah

The pitching staff, nicknamed "Generation K" featured Jason Isringhausen (9-1, 1.55), Paul Wilson (5-3, 2.85) and Bill Pulsipher (6-4, 3.14) but also pitching in were veteran Jimmy Williams (12-6, 3.48), Dave Telgheder (5-4, 2.24), swingman Paul Byrd (3-5, 2.79), Reid Cornelius (7-0, 0.90) and veteran Mike Birkbeck (5-3, 2.36). Bryan Rogers (8-3, 2.21) and Don Florence (0-1, 0.96) paced the relief corps. 3B Butch Huskey's power (.284, 28 HRs, 87 RBI) led the offense with prospects Carl Everett (.300, .462 SLG in 67 games) and Jay Payton (.240) with Ricky Otero (.268) and Alex Ochoa (.309) rounding out

the best outfield in the league. The defense was led by SS Rey Ordóñez (.268) and catchers Alberto Castillo (.267) and John Orton (.254)

**1995 Tucson Toros (Houston Astros)** (87-56) .608, Manager: Rick Sweet

Offensively the team had Bobby Abreu (.304, 516 SLG, 75 RBI), Phil Nevin (.291, 7 HRs), Chris Hatcher .286, 14 HRs), Mike Simms (.295, .549 SLG), Ray Montgomery (.302, 11 HRs), SS Ricky Gutiérrez (.301, 46 runs in 64 games) and 2B Dave Hajek (.327, 99 runs). The pitching staff had highly rated prospect Billy Wagner (5-3, 3.19) and were led by Donne Wall (17-6, 3.30) with contributions from Chris Holt (5-8, 4.10) and veteran Craig McMurtry (6-1, 1.29). The bullpen had closer Mark Small (3-3, 19 saves, 4.09), Rick Huisman (6-1, 4.45), Jimmy Daspit (5-1, 3.57) and Alvin Morman (5-1, 3.91). The pitching staff did go through 30 pitchers though.

**1999 Trenton Thunder (Boston Red Sox)** (92-50) .648, Manager: DeMarco Hale

Lead off hitter David Eckstein had a great season (.313, 109 runs, 32 SBs), as did 1B Dave Gibralter (.299, 24 HRs, 97 RBI), OF Raul González (.335, 18 HRs, 103 RBI) and OF Izzy Alcantara (.294, 20 HRs 60 RBI in 77 games). LF Virgil Chevalier (.293, 13 HRs, 76 RBI) 3B prospect Wilton Veras (.281, 11 HRs, 75 RBI) and catchers Shea Hillenbrand (.259) and Steve Lomasney (.245, 12 HRs, 31 RBI in 4 games) and SS Adam Everett (.263, 10 HRs) all helped out the top offense in the Eastern League. Led by Jason Sekany (14-4, 3.35) the pitching staff also had Tomo Ohka (8-0, 3.00), lefty Andy Hazlett (9-9, 4.16), Paxton Crawford (7-8, 4.08), Sun Woo Kim (9-8, 4.89). The bullpen saw a mix of veterans like Brad Tweedlie (6-0, 3.65), Sal Urso (2-2, 1.55), Chris Cumberland (2-0, 0.43), Kirk Bullinger (1-1, 0.53) 10 saves) and prospects in Rafael Betancourt (6-2, 3.62, 13 saves) and Jeff Taglienti (2.79)
