

APBA'S GREAT TEAMS OF THE PAST

The following great teams of the past are available for use with the APBA MAJOR LEAGUE BASEBALL GAME: (Add 10c each if you live outside the United States and 5c each, sales tax, if you live in Penna.)

1. New York Yankees of 1937—The team that won four consecutive World Series. The great latter day Yankee stars: Joe DiMaggio at his best, Tommy Henrich, Lou Gehrig in his last great year, Lefty Gomez, Red Ruffing, Bill Dickey, Red Rolfe, Frankie Crosetti—manage them all. They'll play for you just as they did for Joe McCarthy in 1937.

2. St. Louis Cardinals of 1934—That famous Gas House Gang managed by their secondbaseman, Frankie Frisch. Here are the irrepressible Pepper Martin, the Great Dizzy Dean and his brother Paul, Lippy Leo Durocher, Joe Medwick and all the rest. Now you can manage them.

3. Detroit Tigers of 1934 — The only Tiger team ever to break a hundred. Led by playing manager Mickey Cochrane to 101 victories were such greats as Charley Gehringer, Hank Greenberg, veteran "Goose" Goslin, "Schoolboy" Rowe and Tommy Bridges. Replay the violent 1934 World Series by matching this team against the Cardinal Gashouse Gang.

4. Philadelphia Athletics of 1931 — Connie Mack's last pennant winning team, considered by some to be his best. Al Simmons, Jimmy Foxx, Mickey Cochrane, Lefty Grove, George Earnshaw, Jimmy Dykes and all the others will play the same sterling game for you they did for Connie Mack more than thirty years ago.

5. New York Yankees of 1927 — called by many the greatest team in the history of baseball—the team that won 110 games—the team of Babe Ruth, who hit 60 homeruns that year, Lou Gehrig, Bob Meusel, Earl Combs, Herb Pennock, Waite Hoyt, Tony Lazzeri, Wilcy Moore—all twenty players perform for you just as they did for Miller Huggins in 1927.

6. Pittsburgh Pirates of 1927 — The greatest pennant — winner in Pittsburgh history. It was an aggregation of stars with a team batting average of .305! Managed by Donie Bush, this team possessed baseball's greatest thirdbaseman, Pie Traynor, the Waner brothers, "Kiki" Cuyler, Glenn Wright and pitchers Carmen Hill and Lee Meadows. Test your own managerial ability with this team against the 1927 Yankees.

7. St. Louis Cardinals of 1926 — the first Cardinal team to win a pennant. Managed by its star secondbaseman, Rogers Hornsby, leading such standout players as Billy Southworth, Jim Bottomley, Chick Hafey, Jess Haines and the Immortal Grover Cleveland Alexander to a pennant and a dramatic World Series victory.

8. The New York Giants of 1922—the only National League club to win four consecutive pennants. Managed by the Immortal John McGraw, this team boasted such stars as Dave Bancroft, Artie Nehf, Ross Young, Casey Stengel, the youthful Fordham Flash, Frank Frisch and Heinie Groh — manage them all and compare them with the teams of today.

9. Detroit Tigers of 1909 — the outstanding Tiger pennant-winning team of the Ty Cobb era. Manage this old club and see how it fares with today's power teams.

10. Pittsburgh Pirates of 1909 — The National League team that won 110 games and defeated the Tigers in an exciting World Series. This team fielded the great all-time shortstop, Honus Wagner, who led his league in batting that year, Manager Fred Clarke, George Gibson, Tom Leach and Babe Adams, who defeated the Tigers three times in that 1909 World Series, which you can re-play, incidentally, by owning both these great teams of 1909.

11. Boston Braves of 1914 — "The Miracle Team" — pennant winners after being in last place as late as July 4th! Sparked by Hall-of-Famer "Rabbit" Maranville, Catcher Hank Gowdy and the phenomenal pitching trio of James, Tyler and Rudolph. George Stallings was the manager of these miracle men. Now you can manage them, too!

12. Chicago Cubs of 1906 — The top winning team of modern major league history. This greatest of Cub teams, under the management of Frank Chance, won 116 games! Here are some of the great players of the early modern era: Joe Tinker, Johnny Evers and Chance—the great double play combination. Catcher Johnny Kling, Outfielder Jimmy Sheckard and those two pitching giants, Ed Reulbach and Mordecai "Three-fingered" Brown. Here's your chance to be a Chance!

13. Chicago White Sox of 1906 — The famous "Hitless Wonders," who startled the baseball world by defeating the "invincible" Cubs in the 1906 World Series. 14. St. Louis Browns of 1922 — They didn't win the pennant. They finished second, one game behind the Yankees, but they were easily the greatest Brownie team in the league's history. Led by the peerless George Sisler, who batted .419 and stole 51 bases, this club had an aggregate team batting average of .313! Ken Williams led the league with 39 homeruns and Urban Shocker was the club's top hurler. Leo Fohl managed this power plant and they'll perform for you with the same batting punch as they did for him.

15. Washington Senators of 1924 — Washington's first and greatest pennant winner. Led by the boy manager, Secondbaseman Stanley "Bucky" Harris, inspiring to victory such famous stars as The Immortal Walter Johnson, the Young "Goose" Goslin, Roger Peckinpaugh and "Muddy" Ruel. They all will perform for you today just as they did for Bucky Harris in 1924.

16. Chicago White Sox of 1917 — The last of the great White Sox teams and virtually the same aggregation that was to become known as the Black Sox in 1919. "Shoeless Joe" Jackson, Swede Risberg, Hap Felsch, Chick Gandil, Buck Weaver, Ray Schalk and the brilliant secondbaseman, Eddie Collins, were just some of the stars on this ill-fated club managed by Clarence "Pants" Rowland. Now you, too, can manage this outstanding group of old time ball players.

17. Cleveland Indians of 1920 — Cleveland's outstanding team of the century, managed by one of the greatest outfielders of all time — Tris Speaker. Among others you can manage on this team are catcher Steve O'Neill, shortstops Ray Chapman and Joe Sewell, outfielders Charlie Jamieson and Joe Wood and pitchers Stanley Coveleski, Jim Bagby and Duster Mails.

18. Brooklyn Dodgers of 1920 — Managed by Wilbert Robinson, this was Brooklyn's outstanding team of the early modern era and had such famous old stars as Zach Wheat, Otto Miller, Burleigh Grimes, Rube Marquard, Leon Cadore and Al Mamaux. With this team and the Indians of 1920 you can replay the 1920 World Series.

19. Boston Red Sox of 1915 — The top Red Sox team of the early years of the American League. Managed by catcher Bill Carrigan, this club had the great all-time outfield of Harry Hooper, Duffy Lewis and Tris Speaker, shortstop Everett Scott, pitchers "Smokey Joe" Wood, Ernie Shore and another young lefthanded hurler by the name of Babe Ruth, who was then beginning to show great promise as a hitter!

20. Philadelphia Phillies of 1915 — This team, managed by Pat Moran, was the first and only Phillies' pennant-winner until 1950. It boasted such great players as Dave Bancroft, Gavvy Cravath, Milton Stock, Bill Killefer, Eppa Rixey and one of the greatest pitchers of all time, Grover Cleveland Alexander, who won 31 games and had an earned run average of 1.22 in 1915, and has an A & C APBA pitching rating. See for yourself how this team performed offensively and defensively, and replay the 1915 World Series by pitting it against the Red Sox.

21. Cincinnati Reds of 1940 — Cincinnati's most outstanding pennant-winner. Managed by Bill McKechnie, this club was comprised of such familiar names as Ernie Lombardi, Eddie Joost, Bucky Walters, Paul Derringer, Jim Turner, Johnny Vandermeer, Buck McCormick, Bill Werber, Ival Goodman and Harry Craft. They won 100 games that year, more than any Cincinnati team since the turn of the century.

22. Philadelphia Athletics of 1911 — The super-team of Connie Mack's early years of dominance in the American League. The great "\$100,000.00 Infield" of Stuffie McInnis, Eddie Collins, Homerun Baker and Jack Barry. The great pitchers, Jack Coombs, Eddie Plank and Chief Bender with their catcher, Ira Thomas. And now you can manage this team of those "glory" years of baseball, just as Connie Mack did in 1911.

23. New York Giants of 1911 — One of the legendary Giant teams of the early years of the John McGraw regime, and perhaps the fastest club on the bases in the history of baseball. This team had the immortal Christy Mathewson and the young Rube Marquard on its pitching staff; Buck Herzog, Larry Doyle, Fred Merkle and Art Fletcher in the infield. Chief Myers was the catcher and Fred Snodgrass, one of the outfielders. Take yourself back to the days when our glorious baseball tradition was just beginning. Replay the 1911 World Series between these two great rival teams.

24. APBA's All-Time Greats (No. ATA) — Twenty of the greatest players of all time (5 pitchers), based on the most outstanding season of each: Cobb, Cochrane, Collins, Dickey, DiMaggio, Foxx, Gehrig, Hornsby, Lajoie, Ruth, Sisler, Traynor, Wagner, Williams, Wilson, Alexander, Feller, Grove, Johnson and Mathewson. Year used and the player's record for that year is included.
