The Taylor Brothers have put together a team that seems to have everything. Everything except a starting shortstop they can call their own. They have lots of choices this year. They could opt for budding power or blazing speed or exceptional defense. Whitey thinks they'll stick to the local product: *Xander Bogaerts*. While he doesn't have a great card, he gets to play a lot, another advantage.

# **#6 NEW WESTMINSTER**

Gee, where to start? Jim could go in a number of directions, and all would help his team. Whitey thinks he'll rebuild slowly. A second baseman could be a good fit here, since there are several. And the point is to take a player who sucks... for this year at least. *Javier Baez* can help New West meet its goal of drafting with the first overall pick next year.

### **#7 LAS VEGAS**

Paul H. basically has everything covered, but some positions are so thinly veiled that you can see right through them. The point is, though, that for the first time in a while, Paul can choose a player he wants vs. a position he needs. And he's shown a propensity in the past for accomplished players. Whitey thinks *Josh Harrison*, a once and future Gambler, is the answer Paul seeks. He can cover multiple positions. Maybe all at the same time.

### **#8 BROBDINGNAG**

Joe already knows whom he's taking here. He's done his analysis, which told him to trade for this exact pick. He knows the player he wants will float down to him, seemingly by accident. So who

does he want? Who the hell knows? But Whitey thinks age will play a role: **Rougned Odor** is his type of player: little present value, all future value.

Instead, he'll pick the best player available, in his mind — one who will be able to contribute for years to come, one who delivers present value with the promise of future growth: *Masahiro Tanaka*. It just so happens that he's a Yankee.

### **#11 COLUMBUS**

In a down year after a disappointing 2014, Vic just wants to add talent. He likes power. He's shown a weakness for players with speed. If only he could find a player with both... Wait! There's **George Springer**! Whitey thinks the combination will intrigue Vic.

### **#12 HOBOKEN**

Sorry, Steve P. It just feels weird to write "Hoboken." It's like saying, "San Jose Athletics" or "Salt Lake City Devil Rays." Anyway, Whitey applauds Steve for populating his outfield in last year's draft. Now, how about the infield? *Nick Castellanos* is one answer.

# **#13 NORTHBORO**

So let's assume Bob and Steve took Jose Abreu. If they have, it might mean they want to ramp up quickly, to take advantage of the pitching they developed. In that case, *Joe Panik*, welcome to the team.

### **#14 MELROSE**

What do you give to the guy who has everything? How about a guy who can pinch-hit, pinch-run, and play second base as well as Dan Uggla (a long-time Avenger)? *Mookie Betts*. As a bonus, he's a Red Sox player for a diehard fan.

### **#15 HUDSON**

Clay, it was a long ride to the World Series and short ride down the escalator of rebuilding. Hope you enjoyed it. To get back to the top, he knows he'll need many things, but Whitey thinks he'll start with pitching, maybe because he hasn't tried that path recently. *Drew Hutchinson* gives him many starts this year and many more in the future.

### **#16 WARRENTON**

If only Trader Jack had traded up; he might have been able to snag Panik, but it's too late now. So Jackson goes to Plan B. He'll swallow a mouthful of West Coast ale, reach across the country, and select *Jake Odorizzi* to bolster his starting staff.

# **#17 GOTHAM CITY**

Anyone who trades for a 40-year-old starting pitcher is someone who is not afraid to take performance over youth. However, having said that, anyone who wants to contend will go enter the season with Fernando Abad as his closer. *Dellin Betances*.

### **#18 GREATER OHIO**

Devlin likes to win. He likes players with power. Whitey thinks these two factors point to *J.D. Martinez* as his pick. Martinez adds instant credibility to his lineup, and he'll enjoy rolling those virtual dice on that card all season long.

### **#19 BERKSHIRE**

Welcome to the League, Mike! It must be nice to inherit such a vast collection of talent. All you have to do is step in, roll the die, and win! No one knows Mike's preferences, but he doesn't need much to go deep into the playoffs. Whitey doesn't think he's mess with that. Who would? So adding a pinch-hitting toy who could work out in the future seems like a good option: *Jorge Soler*.

#### #20 MARACAIBO

Walter is an easy read, and not just because he's a writer. In novels, there are plot twists. In TBL, there are holes to fill. Whitey thinks Walter will do the obvious and bolster his rotation. He needs a lot of starts to not be ridiculous, and remember, no Maracaibo team has ever lost 100 games in a season. To maintain that success, *Jacob deGrom* is a nice sparring partner for Cole Hamels.

### **#21 WHITMAN**

Brian is a shrewd guy. Sure he needs starts, and if deGrom or McHugh were available, he'd be tempted to take one of them, but Whitey knows he's been looking for many years at the black hole in the spot where his shortstop normally would bat. After "fixing" his third base problem with Castellanos, Dr. Steve could conceivably turn his attention to the mess his pitching staff has become. #### **#23 ZION**

Rich has another strong team, but with some needs. Take his starting pitching. I would. Whitey's just saying it's a little thin. There's no way that Scott Baker will make any starts for this team. So running down the list of starters still available, *Roenis Elias* jumps out as a hard-throwing pitcher with lots of starts. Both are good things.

### **#24 BROBDINGNAG**

Joe would look at the list above and shake his head in wonder. That's because Whitey knows as well as anyone that these draft predictions are based not on intuition or careful research, but on misdirection and convincing rhetoric. So, with this pick, the last pick of the first round of the 2015 TBL rookie draft, in keeping with his future-value philosophy for this year, Joe takes *Gregory Polanco*.
