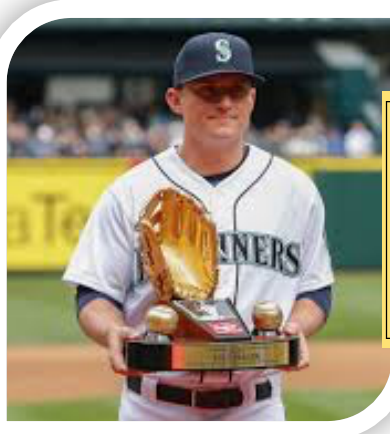

Walt Taylor guides Whatever's to fifth OAPBA title Whats remarkable second half finish wraps up 2016 championship

Walt Taylor's Whatever's (47-33) celebrated the franchise's 29th season in the league by seizing the OAPBA title in dominant fashion in 2016.

In the first half, the Whatever's edged the Taz Devils and Road Warriors to win the half by a single game. The Whatever's finished the second half by winning fourteen of 15 games, clinching the second half title with five games left on their schedule. By virtue of winning both halves, the Whatever's won the 2016 OAPBA championship without having to undergo World Series competition, the second straight season in which the OAPBA championship was clinched without a World Series.



Walt Taylor won his fourth OAPBA championship in 2016. Walt previously won titles with the Travelers (2005) and Whats, in 2006 and 2007.

The first half was one of the closest halves in OAPBA history with the Whatever's winning their last three in a row over the defending champion Otters to finish a single game ahead of Dave Larson's Taz Devils and Marc Bostrom's Road Warriors and only two games ahead of Jonathan Stilwell's defending champion Otters. Only Rod Caborn's Beefers were out of the first half pennant fight.

In the second half, the Whatever's broke open a tight second half race by winning 14 of their last 15 games. They nailed down the second half with five games left in the second half, behind Carlos Carrasco, who beat the Beefers 4-3 for the clincher. The Taz Devils, 24-16 for the second half, won four of five from the Whatever's to conclude the second half only one game behind the Whats, but the second half title had already been clinched before the season-ending series.

Taylor's Whatever's (47-33) relied, instead on a balanced performance that was accented by a deep, reliable bullpen that won 20 games. Carrasco (8-2) was the leading Whats starter while Kyle Seager hit 16 HR and drove in 37 runs to pace the Whatever offense.

For the first time in league history, the Most Valuable Player award was split between two players: **CF Mike Trout** of the Otters and **3b Kyle Seager** of the Whatever's. For Trout, the honor marked the second time in league history that a player has won back-to-back MVP honors (**Barry Bonds, Highlanders**, won in 1992 ad 1993).

The Cy Young award went to lefty **Cole Hamels** of the Beefers, who led the league in ERA while going 7-4 and striking out 127 batters. **Wade Davis** of the Taz Devils, won four games and had a miniscule 1.10 ERA, backed up by seven saves.

OAPBA finishes 29th season; contracts to five teams with Dave Mitchell's departure

For the second straight season, OAPBA was forced to contract with Dave Mitchell's Piranhas, one of the mainstay franchises, dropping out of the league. Mitchell's departure was the league's fourth franchise loss in the past three seasons, preceded by the loss of Steven Korb in 2015 and Joe Passiatore and Kris Stenger in 2014.

For 2016, OAPBA continued with an 80-game schedule, consisting of two 40-game halves with the winners of the two halves playing in the World Series. If a team won both halves, they captured the league title without a World Series. The trading period at the halfway point was retained.

Because of contraction, and the resultant buildup of super-grade pitching staffs, three major rule changes were adopted for '16; one in roster management, one for pitching, and the third in drafting.

Rosters were reduced from 35 players to 30 players and the notion of an "active" player pool was introduced. Twenty-eight of each team's 30 rostered players were allowed to be eligible to play in any series during the season. For each individual series, 25 of the 28 active pool players were designated for eligibility in the individual series. Prior to sending out lineups, managers identified, in advance, which players were designated actives for the upcoming series.

Two rostered players were designated taxi squad players and ineligible to play during the season. Taxi squad players were allowed to be traded, but could not be added to their new team's 28-man active squad (i.e. taxi squad players could only be traded for taxi squad players).

Players designated J-4, if designated as an active player, were required to remain on a team's active 25-man roster for the entire season.

Pitchers had a change in that they were limited to their average batters faced per appearance on top of the Q-factor fatigue rule. This made complete games a rarity, just like the current major leagues. This also meant more relief appearances.

For relievers, the long and middle relief pitcher classifications were dropped with the only the closer designation retained. Closers were designated by the use the save ratio of .30 to 1.00 to classify closers (number of saves divided by the number of appearances or Saves/Appearances).

All pitchers were limited to their average batters faced per appearance. Starting pitchers were allowed a 10% increase in that total (batters faced number divided by the number of starts multiplied by 1.1 represented by the formula $BF/starts \times 1.1$) Round up if the number is .5 or higher, round down if the number is .499 or less.

Starters were required to leave a game once they face their maximum number of batters except with two outs. A starter was allowed to finish an inning, but but penalized five points for each batter faced after reaching his batters faced limit. The rule allowing pitchers to complete a shutout was eliminated.

Relief pitchers were allowed one extra batter over their average batters faced, except with two outs. Then a reliever were allowed to get the last out, but with a penalty of five points for each additional batter faced.

In the draft, each of the five teams drafted two MLB teams from the American League from which to select players. The same procedure was designated for 2017, only drafting from National League teams.

The draft order for the 2016 remained in reverse order of finish from the previous season. The 2016 draft order was 1) Tasmanian Devils, 2) Beefers, 3) Road Warriors, 4) Whatever's and 5) Otters.

2017 Regular Season

First half: Whatever's take first half by a hair; edge Devils, Roadies by one game

In one of OAPBA's best-ever pennant battles, Walt Taylor's Whatever's came from behind to beat the Jonathan Stilwell's Otters their last three games of the first half and win the first half title by a single game over the Taz Devils and Road Warriors and two games ahead of the Otters.

Consistent winners in the first half, the Whats started the 2016 campaign with seven wins in 11 games,

including back-to-back 1-0 shutouts by the combination of **Garrett Richards** and four relievers at the Otters and a complete game shutout by **Zack Greinke** at Moss Park to beat the Road Warriors.

At the halfway point of the first half, only three games separated the first-place Whatever's (12-8) and the last place Beefers (9-11). The Road Warriors (11-9), Taz Devils (10-10) and Otters (10-10) all were breathing down the Whatever's necks.

As the race wound down, the Whats hosted the Otters (18-17) in a critical series. The Whats lost the opener 5-3 in 15 innings and then lost 3-0 to **Jacob deGrom**, pulling the Otters to within a game of the lead. The Whatever's rebounded however, to take three grueling victories, including a 5-4, 10-inning win in Game Four to head into their final series at 20-15.

With five games to go in the first half race, the Whats (20-15) held a two game lead over the Tazzies, Road Warriors and Otters, all of whom were 18-17.

In a pennant-deciding series, the Whats traveled to the Taz Devils' Yosemite Park, where their bats fell asleep in the first two games, losing the opener 5-0 to **Chris Archer**, who tossed a two hitter, and the second game 3-0 to **Clayton Kershaw**. After dropping the third game 3-2, in 11 innings, the Whats stood at 20-18 and the Devils stood at 21-17 and only one win away from clinching the first half. The Whats **Carlos Carrasco**, however, responded with a 3-0 shutout to tie the Whats and Devils at 21-18 with one game to go. In a memorable conclusion to the first half, the game was tied 1-1 in the ninth. **Edwin Encarnacion** slammed a solo homer to give the Whats the lead. **Jonathan Papelbon** and **Jeff Manship** closed out the Devils for the title.

Equally in contention were Marc Bostrom's Road Warriors, who followed the same pattern as the Devils, beating the Otters in the first three games of their final series to improve to 21-17, but dropping the final two games to the Otters to finish at 21-19, a lone game behind the Whats.

Second half: Whatever win 14 of final 15 games to seize second half, 2016 championship

The Whatever's began the second half with a rush. They knocked off the Taz Devils in three of five at home in Highland Park, then pounded the Beefers winning four of five, including shutouts by Zack Greinke and Garret Richards, to start 7-3. The Whats then ran into trouble, dropping three of five at Frank Selee Field to the Otters and three of five at home against the Road Warriors for an 11-9 record at the halfway point in the second half.



For the second year in a row, **Marc Bostrom**'s Road Warriors struggled for runs, but Bostrom was able to spur the Roadies to a 40-40, .500

The Taz Devils, meanwhile, signaled early that they would contend beating the Road Warriors in three of five to open the second half and, in a series played at the SABR annual meeting in Miami, taking three in a row from the Beefers, upping their record to 6-4. After dropping three of five to the Beefers in their second series, the Devils lost the opener of a series to the Otters 4-3 in 10 innings, but swept the final four games of the series to improve to 12-8, a game ahead of the Whatever's.

The Road Warriors played at a .500 level over the first part of the second half and were 10-10 at the halfway point, only two games behind the Whats and a game behind the Devils. The Otters and Beefers started slowly and were 8-12 at the halfway point, both out of the race.

The Whatever's then cranked it up and swept the Road Warriors in five straight, knocking the South Orlando aggregation out of the race. They followed up by taking four of five from the Otters and then swept the Beefers in five games,

clinching the second half pennant with five games left.

The Whats five-game sweep over the Beefers became doubly important because the Taz Devils continued to play at a .600 clip, climaxing the season with a stunning five game sweep over the Whatevers to complete the half only a single game behind the Whats.

The Whatevers 14-1 stretch run concluded one of the most impressive pennant drives in league history and the Whats needed every single win to win the second half and win the 2016 championship.

The Road Warriors lost three of five to the Beefers to start their stretch run, falling to 12-13. After taking four from the Otters, the Roadies climbed to 16-14, but then they lost seven of 10 to the Whatevers in back-to-back series, falling out of the race and finishing the second half at 19-21, six games behind.

The Otters second half fell apart at the halfway point. The Otters went 6-14 down the stretch, including 12 losses in their final 15 games, winding up in the second half cellar and tied with the Beefers for fourth (last) place with a 34-36 record in the cumulative standings.

Co-MVPs Mike Trout, Kyle Seager head OAPBA All Star team for 2016

Some of the tightest voting in league history saw an OAPBA first in 2016. **Whatevers 3b Kyle Seager** and **Otters CF Mike Trout** were voted as the co-winner of the **OAPBA Most Valuable Player award**. Seager and Trout each had two first place votes and two second place votes leading to the honor being split. **Devil** first baseman **Paul Goldschmidt** finished third with a first place vote and two third place votes. **Anthony Rizzo, Bryce Harper, and Jose Altuve** also gained MVP votes.

Trout led the circuit in home runs, total bases, and slugging percentage, finished fifth overall in RBIs, on-base percentage, and batting average. He was second in runs scored and base hits. Without **Trout**, the **Otters** would have finished well down stream in the league standings. **Seager** was the main power source for the league champion **Whatevers**. Seager was seventh in the league in RBIs and fourth in home runs. His defense at third base anchored a strong infield.

The league top hurler was also a shootout in the voting. **Beefers Cole Hamels** took top honors with a pair of first place votes. **Jake Arrieta** of the **Road Warriors** finished second with a first, second, and third place vote. **Devil** lefty **Clayton Kershaw** was third with eight points, based on a first place and second vote. The top three candidates finished with ten, nine, and eight points respectively. **Michael Wacha, Lance Lynn, Carlos Carrasco, Zack Grienke, and Max Scherzer** also received votes.

Reliever of the year balloting was all **Wade Davis**. The **Tasmanian Devils** hurler had four first place votes and a second. **Kenley Jansen** of the **Roadies** got the other first place vote and a pair of third place votes to finish third in the balloting. **Keone Kela** of the league champs, finished second three second place and a third place vote. **Javier Lopez** of the **Devils** also got a third place vote.

The All-Star Team had several unanimous selections. **Paul Goldschmidt, Buster Posey, Manny Machado, and Mike Trout** had little competition at their positions.

The **Devils** first sacker, **Goldschmidt**, led OAPBA in RBIs and runs scored while finishing second in total bases. **Road Warrior Anthony Rizzo** was second in the balloting while the league's leading hitter, **Freddie Freeman** of the **Otters** was third. **Adrian Gonzalez** of the **Beefers** also had votes.

Tasmanian backstop **Buster Posey** was the top vote getter. **Posey** led all catchers in batting average, RBIs, and doubles. **Roadie Russell Martin** was second in vote followed by **James McCann** of the **Beefers**. **Jason Castro, Salvatore Perez, and Wilson Ramos** were also on the ballots.

Otter third baseman, **Manny Machado** made a successful move to shortstop and to win All-Star honors. He was among the league leaders in rbi, runs scored, and doubles. Devil **Brandon Crawford** was second while the Whats **Francisco Lindor** was third. **Troy Tulowitzki** and **Carlos Correa** also received votes.

Centerfield was all **Mike Trout**. **The Otter** league MVP outpaced four other fly catchers for top honors. **Adam Jones** of the **Whatevers** finished second. **Lorenzo Cain** of the **Devils** and **Beefers Andrew McCutchen** tied for third. **Billy Hamilton** was also named.

Second base had two players dominate the balloting. One player had three first place and two second place votes while the other had two first place and three second place votes. **Beefers Jason Kipnis** out polled **Devil Jose Altuve** 21 points to 19. The pair finished second and third in batting average. **Roughned Odor** had two third place votes while **Brian Dozier**, **DJ LeLahieu**, and **Brandon Phillips** each received a vote.

While **Kyle Seager** tied for the league MVP honors, he had competition as **OAPBA's** best at the hot corner. The **Whatever** slugger got 19 points while **Road Warrior Nolan Arenado** received 16 points. **Otter Todd Frazier** and **Devil Josh Donaldson** tied for third place.

Michael Brantley, left fielder for the **Whatevers**, easily won the voting. He was among the leaders in batting average, on base percentage, doubles, runs scored, and stolen bases. His 23 points easily topped second place finisher, **Beefers Colby Rasmus**. **Corey Dickerson**, **Kris Davis**, **Starling Marte**, **Ben Revere**, and **Christian Yelich** also were named on ballots.

Road Warrior Bryce Harper earned 19 points to edge **Devil Ryan Braun**, with 16 points. Harper was second in the circuit in OBP and among the league's best in RBIs, home runs, doubles, runs scored, and led OAPBA in BB. **Giancarlo Stanton** and **Jose Bautista** earned eight and three points respectively.

Four players received votes for the top utility player. Versatile Otter infielder, **Logan Forsyth** outpaced **Marwin Gonzalez**, **Brock Holt**, and **Nori Aoki**.

2016 OAPBA Draft

Taz Devils take 2015 MLB champion Kansas City with first draft pick in 2016 draft

In 2016, with only five teams in the league, the draft was re-configured to avoid the creation of Super All Star teams that would totally suppress offenses. While well-intended, the results did not balance with offenses down considerably and pitching totally dominant in 2017.

As usual, draft was held in the reverse order of finish from 2015, with the Taz Devils, who had the league’s second-worst W-L record in 2015 drafting first and the Otters, who won the ’15 championship drafting fifth. The Devils had the first pick in 2016 in the absence of the Piranhas, who finished last in 2015 and disbanded after the season.



Reliever **Wade Davis**, who won Reliever of the Year honors, headlined the first round selection of Kansas City by Dave Larson’s Taz Devils

The rest of the draft, however, took on an entirely new look, including:

- Roster reduction to 30 players, a reduction of five players from all previous seasons
- Ten rounds, instead of 15 rounds
- The establishment of a “floating” 28 man roster, instead of a set 25-man roster, with three players from the 28-man roster designated “active” prior to the beginning of each series
- OAPBA teams drafted two MLB teams and drafting only from those two selected teams

The 2016 draft marked the first time in the past five seasons that a manager other than Dave Mitchell, whose Piranhas disbanded after 2015, had the first draft pick. OAPBA team by team 2016

Whatevers 47-33, .588; 1st half 22-18, .550, +1 game, 2nd half 25-15, .625, +1 game

Second place finishers in both halves in 2015, manager Walt Taylor's Whatevers dominated OAPBA in 2016 as Walt won his third championship at the helm of the Whats and fourth overall during his tenure in OAPBA.

The Whats won via a combination of power, balance, and an ability to pull out wins late in games. They hit 99 home runs as a team and were 20-9 in one-run games, which reflected on their deep, effective bullpen. In extra inning games, the Whats were 8-3. At home, the Whats were a league best 25-15 at home and led the league with a 22-18 away record. In a reflection of their balance, Whatever pitchers threw four shutouts in both the first and second halves.

The Whats had to battle to win the first half by one game over Dave Larson's Taz Devils, Marc Bostrom's Taz Devils and Jonathan Stilwell's Otters.

Consistent winners in the first half, the Whats started the 2016 campaign with seven wins in 11 games, including back-to-back 1-0 shutouts by Garrett Richards and the relief corps and Zach Grienke over the Otters and Road Warriors. At the halfway point, the Whats were 12-8, but then dropped three of five to Larson's Devils, who cut the What lead to one game.

The Whats won six of their next 10 games to improve to 20-15 as they entered their final series of the first half, at Yosemite Park against the Taz Devils. The Tazzies won the first three games, including back to back shutouts by Chris Archer and Clayton Kershaw and a 3-2 win by reliever Javier Lopez to jump into a tie for the first half lead, with the Road Warriors, by a single game. The Whats fought back, however, with a 3-0 shutout by Carlos Carrasco and a 2-1 win by Jonathan Papebon to finish at 22-18, a game ahead of the Devils and Road Warriors, who also lost their final two games of the first half to the Otters.

The Whats started 7-3 in the second half, winning three of five from the Devils and four of five, including a pair of shutouts, from the Beefers. Things began to tighten up, however, as the Whats lost three of five in their next two series, at the Otters and home against Marc Bostrom's Road Warriors, making their record 11-9 at the second half halfway point.

From that point on, however, it was all Whatevers. The Whats swept the Road Warriors on the road and then took four of five from the Otters to improve to 20-10. The Whats then rolled over the Beefers, in a hotly contested series, sweeping all five games and clinching the second half title...and the 2016 championship...in the final game against the Beefs.



Carlos Carrasco was the leading winner for the champion Whatevers at 8-2, 2.82.

As it turned out, the Whats needed the sweep, as they lost five of five at Yosemite Park to the Devils to finish the season. The Whats concluded the second half at 25-15, a game ahead of the Devils.

The Whats only had two starting pitchers **Carlos Carrasco** (8-2, 2.82), **Zack Greinke** (6-4, 2.30, 2 shutouts) with winning records. Their bullpen, however, shouldered the load going 20-12, 3.16). Relievers **Zach McAllister** (4-1, 3.16), **Sam Dyson** (4-4, 2.44), and closer **Jonathan Papelbon** (4-2, 4.91, 8 saves) all totaled four wins apiece.

Offensively, **3b Kyle Seager** hit only .206, but he made his hits count, hitting 16 HR and driving home a team-high 37 RBIs. **CF Adam Jones** (.215, 10 HR) drove in 29 runs and **Edwin Encarnacion** (.179, 11 HR, 19 RBI) was a force off the bench.

Rookie **SS Francisco Lindor** (.217) stole 18 bases and anchored the infield. Longtime Whatever fan favorite **RF Giancarlo Stanton** hit .275 and hit 13 HR in only 142 at bats.

Taz Devils 45-35, .563; 1st half 21-19, .525, -1 game, 2nd half 24-16, .600, -1 game

The Tazzies turned things around in 2016, improving to an impressive 45-35 after a losing season in 2015, coming within an eyelash of winning both halves and finishing second in both races by a single game in each half.

The Devils led the league in hitting (.228), on-base percentage (.293), runs scored (312) and doubles (162). **Devils pitchers struck out a league-record 790 batters**, breaking their own league record (previously 748 Ks in 2007). Defensively, the Devils only committed a league-low 28 errors.

RF Ryan Braun gave the Devils a great second half and wound up the season hitting .338 with 11 HR and 30 RBI in only 145 AB, which had Devils fans wondering what might have been had Braun been available for the entire season. **1b Paul Goldschmidt** got off to a slow start but wound up hitting 17 HR and a league-leading 50 RBIs. **3b Josh Donaldson** (.206, 13 HR, 31 RBI) also was an offensive mainstay for the Devils.

2b Jose Altuve (.271, 6 HR, 31 RBI, 14-1 on stolen bases) contended for the 2016 batting title for a good portion of the season. **C Buster Posey** (.251, 9 HR) added to his reputation as one of OAPBA's best-ever catchers. Reserve IF Brock Holt hit .310 and **OF Corey Dickerson**, obtained in a mid-season trade with the Beefers, hit .370 in the second half.

Lefty Clayton Kershaw (9-4, 3.46, 134 Ks) continued to perform at a high level and newcomer **Chris Archer** (8-6, 3.58, 115 Ks) was one of the league's win leaders. The Devils bullpen (2.23, 18 saves) led the league in ERA with closer **Wade Davis** (4-1, 1.01, 7 saves) and setup man **Javier Lopez** (1.20 in 35 appearances) the mainstays in the pen. Part-time closer **Mark Melancon** (1.80, 3 saves), and workhorse **Ryan Madson** (3-1, 2.23) also excelled in relief.

Road Warriors 40-40, .500; 1st half 21-19, .525, -1 game, .19-21 2nd half, .475, -6 games

Despite severe offensive shortcomings and a decline in their overall pitching performance, Marc Bostrom's Road Warriors came within a game of tying for the first half title and wound up 40-40 for the 2016 season.



Taz Devils skipper **Dave Larson** came within a game of winning the first and second halves. Larson's all-time .558 winning percentage is the best among OAPBA managers.



Road Warrior **Chris Davis** hit five pinch hit home runs during 2016, a new league record. The old record was four pinch-hit HRs in a single season by Carlos Lee, Beefers, in 2004.

For the second year in a row, the Road Warriors struggled to score runs, hitting only .205 as a team (an improvement versus 2015, when they hit .203) to finish last in the league and getting shut out 10 times in the 2016 campaign. Compounding a league-worst .273 OPB, the Road Warriors hit only 76 home runs, also last in the league and drew a league low 218 BB. The Road Warriors defense committed 43 errors, leading to 27 unearned runs allowed.

The Roadies struggled to score runs, losing 10 games via shutouts in 2016. Nevertheless, Marc Bostrom somehow kept figuring out a way to win, going 12-5 in one-run games, the best in OAPBA in 2016, keeping the Roadies in the thick of the first half race and competitive in the second half.

1b Anthony Rizzo (.230, 11 HR, 48 RBI) led the Road Warriors in RBIs for the second straight season while **RF Bryce Harper** (.238, 13 HR, 43 RBI) showed plenty of power and **3b Nolan Arenado** (.220, 15 HR, 44 RBI) led the team in home runs. **CF Billy Hamilton** had trouble getting on base (.218, 1 HR, 6 RBI), but once he got on base, was a threat, stealing 27 bases.

On the hill, righty starter **Jake Arrieta** (9-5, 2.43) was outstanding, backed up by **Lance Lynn** (8-5, 2.53) and longtime Road Warriors ace

Felix Hernandez (7-4, 2.59), who improved his career record, entirely with the Road Warriors, to 50-62, 3.79. Road Warrior pitchers allowed 99 home runs, the most in the league in 2016.

In the bullpen, Road Warrior closer **Kenley Jansen** (1-1, 1.29, league-leading 15 saves) was excellent while workhorses **Mark Lowe** (2.94) and **Pedro Strop** (3.13) were also reliable

Otters 34-46, .425 -13 games; 1st half 20-20, .500, -2 games, 2nd half 14-26, .350, -11 games

During the first half, Jonathan Stilwell's Otters continued their fine 2015 championship form and finished at 20-20, only two games behind in the first half race. The second half, however, was a different story with the Otters plummeting to 14-26, last place in the second half race. For the season, the Otters wound up in a fourth place tie with the Beefers (34-36).

As a team, the Otters hit only .204, last in the league, but they hit for power, leading the league with 100 home runs, and hit 158 doubles, second in the league, and led the league in slugging at .392. Otters batters drew a league high 269 walks, but the Otters only stole ten bases for the season, a reflection on their dependence on their power hitters during the 2016 season.

The Otters pitching for 2016 was their weakest link, with a league high 3.77 ERA. Otter pitchers gave up 93 home runs, second most in the league and surrendered a league high 298 runs.



Otter manager **Jonathan Stilwell** came within two games of winning the first half title.

In the first half, the Otters kept teetering on the brink of falling out of the race, but showed grit by rebounding time after time.

After starting the first half 8-5, the Otters lost seven of their next nine to fall to 10-12. After winning the final three games of a home series against the Taz Devils, however, the Otters moved back into contention at 13-12. However, the Otters then lost the first three games of their road series at the Road Warriors to drop to 13-15. Looking like they were out of the first half title picture, the Otters again fought back to win the final two games of their series at Moss Park by scores of 7-2 and 3-2 to even their record at 15-15. Returning to Frank Selee Field, the Otters took three of five from the Beefers to climb to 18-17.

Facing the league-leading Whatever's away from home in a critical series that decided the first half championship, the Otters won the opener 5-3 in a grueling 15-inning contest and then took the league lead with a 3-0 shutout. The first half pennant was not to be, however, as the Whats took the final three games of the deciding series by scores of 3-1, 5-4 in 10 innings, and 2-1 in the final game. The Otters finished two games behind the Whats in one of OAPBA's best-ever half-season pennant chases.

The Otters second half was troublesome after the first two series. After opening the second half with a tough 4-3, 11-inning win over the Taz Devils, the Otters lost the next seven in a row to drop to 1-7. The Otters won their next three straight to get to 4-7 and eventually got to 7-9, when the Otters hit a five-game skid, all on the road, losing the finale of a series 4-0 to the Beefers Cole Hamels and then dropping the first four in a row at the Road Warriors, to fall to 7-12. Four straight wins lifted the Otters to 11-12. From that point on, however, the defending champions won only two more games, dropping 10 of their final 12 games, to finish 14-26, in last place for the second half.

Otter **1b Freddie Freeman** had an outstanding season, winning the OAPBA batting title (.297) and leading the league in OBP (.383). Freeman also hit 21 doubles. **CF Mike Trout** led won the OAPBA home run title (22) and was fifth in the league with 42 RBIs. 42 runs. **3b Todd Frazier** slammed 11 HR and drove in 30 and, even though he only hit .199, drove in 33 runs with 12 HR. As a team, the Otter hit .204, last in the league, but

Beefers 34-46, .425, -13, 1st half 16-24, .400, -6 games, 18-22 2nd half, -7 games

The Beefers were in rebuilding mode in 2016, occupying the OAPBA cellar in the first half with a dismal 16-24 record, but improving to fourth place in the second half (18-22). For the season, the Beefers wound up in a fourth place tie with Jonathan Stilwell's Otters with both teams finishing 34-36. The Beefers had a league worst 15-25

record at home and were 0-7 in extra inning games. On the bright side, the Beefs earned the first round draft pick for 2017 by virtue of their head-to-head 11-9 season record against the Otters.

The Beefers got off track in their first series of the season, dropping three of five at Yosemite Park to the Devils. They followed by losing three of five in their next two series and hit the halfway point with a 9-11 mark. It was all downhill as they Beefs lost all five of their remaining series in the first half, finishing six games out at 16-24.

The Beefs got off to another slow start in the second half, including a five-game losing streak, but split their next 20 games, (including a second five-game losing streak, to improve to 14-16. The wheels fell off, however, at Highland Park, losing all five games at the Whatevers home field to fall to 14-21. Entering the final series with only a remote chance to climb out of the second half cellar, the Beefs responded, winning four of five from the Otters to finish 18-22, in fourth place for the second half.

Despite scoring 10 runs or more in five games, the Beefers hit only .208 as a team and had an abysmal .275 OBP, while setting a team record with 704 strikeouts. Lacking speed, the Beefs managed only 31 stolen bases, which put considerable pressure on the hitters to hit for power to score runs. Defensively, the Beefs made 54 errors, most in the league.

The Beefer pitching was outstanding in 2016, leading the league in ERA (2.85) and setting a team record for fewest runs allowed (261) and most strikeouts in a single season (679).

The starting staff had a winning record of 30-29, 2.73, led by southpaw **Cole Hamels** (7-4, league-leading 2.10) and righthander **Max Scherzer** (7-7, 3.02). **Michael Wacha** (6-6, 2.17) was 5-1, 1.43 over the first half but reversed course at the halfway point, going 1-5, 3.04 over the second half. **Johnny Cueto** (6-5, 3.40) had a solid season and **Dallas Keuchel** (4-6, 2.80) participated in two combination shutouts, including a near no-hitter against the Otters in the final series of the season.



Lefty **Cole Hamels** (7-4, 2.10) became the first Beefer to ever win the OAPBA ERA title in the team's 27-year history.

The Beef bullpen finished dismal 4-17, allowing 23 HR, with a 3.21 ERA. **Joaquin Benoit** (3-2, 2.20) and lefty **Tony Sipp** (0-0, 2.94) were effective in long relief. Closers **Zach Britton** (0-4, 4.64, 6 saves) and **Brad Zeigler** (0-3, 2.45, 6 saves), however, suffered several late inning setbacks. The inability of the bullpen to perform was underlined in the Beefers 9-17 record in one-run games.

The Beefs leading hitter was **2b Jason Kipnis** (.292) while **LF Colby Rasmus** led the team with 17 HR. Longtime **1b Adrian Gonzalez** hit only .227, but hit 22 doubles and 12 HRs to drive in 38 runs. Illustrative of the Beefer hitting woes, the Beefer outfield (Rasmus, .174, 17 HR, **CF Andrew McCutchen**, .199, 3 HR, and **RF J.D. Martinez**, .158, 10 HR) hit a combined .179 and a combined OBP of .277 with 30 HRs.

2016 Notes

Road Warrior Chris Davis was a pinch-hitting powerhouse in 2016. Davis hit five pinch-hit home runs to set a new OAPBA record for pinch hit homers in a single season. A rundown of Davis's pinch-hitting achievement:

- In the first half, Davis homered off Beefer reliever **Zach Britton** in a 7-2 Warrior win.
- Against the Whats. Davis homered off reliever **Keone Kela** to lead off the top of the 10th. Davis HR snapped a 3-3 tie and the inspired Warriors scored two more in the 10th, leading to a 6-3 Roadie win.
- Also at the Whatevers, Davis hit a three-run pinch hit HR off **Zach McAlister** in the top of the 6th, to overcome a 2-0 Whatever lead. Davis three-run home resulted in the winning runs in a Warrior victory.

- At the Warriors, against the Beefers in the second half, Davis hit a pinch-hit shot off lefty **Tony Sipp** in the bottom of the 8th inning, tying the game and leading to another pinch hit HR, by teammate **Gerardo Parra** in the bottom of the 9th, a three-run walk-off pinch hit homer that won the game for the Roadies.
- At the Whatevers in the second half, Davis homered off starter **Matt Harvey** to pull the Warriors to within a run, but it wasn't enough as the Whatevers hung on to win 4-3.

The Road Warriors failed to score 10 or more runs in a single game during the entire 2016 season. The last time the Roadies scored in double figures was in their 71st game of the 2015 campaign, a 10-7 win over Dave Mitchell's Piranhas.

The **Whatevers were 20-9 in one-run games and 8-3 in extra innings**, underscoring the strength of their bullpen, which won a collective 20 games. At the other end of the spectrum, the Beefers were 0-7 in extra inning contests.

Devils southpaw **Chris (Condor) Sale** (*right*) was like the girl with the curl; "When he was good, he was very good. And when he was bad, he was horrid." The Tazzie lefty, in his first start against the Otters, pitched a complete game, **fanning 14**, allowing just four hits and one run. His next start against the Otters went differently. The Oshkosh favorites pounded Sale for 12 hits and 12 runs in three innings in a 15-4 Otter first half win. The Beefers also administered a whooping on the Condor, ripping him for 12 runs on 14 hits in a 13-3 second half Beefer victory. In his last start of the season, against the **Whatevers**, Sale threw seven scoreless innings, **fanning 14**.



The **Otters scored 15 runs** in the onslaught of the **Devils** in the **Sale** game, pounding out 18 hits total, with four round trippers. **Jose Bautista** did the most damage, driving home five runs. The **Beefers** got 18 hits with seven free passes in their assault on **Sale** and the **Devils** in their 13-3 win. Every **Beefer** player in the game got a hit including starter **Michael Wacha** and reliever **Alex Wilson**.

The **Tazzies** got back at the **Otters** for the earlier shellacking, pounding the boys from **Oshkosh** 14-4. The **Devils** slugged seven homers in the game, two each from **Paul Goldschmidt**, **Corey Dickerson**, and **Ryan Braun**. And, yes, **Chris Sale** was the starter getting revenge for the **Tazzies**.

Whatever pitchers threw an incredible 12 shutouts among their 47 wins in 2016. The Whats won four 1-0 games, none bigger than their final shutout of the year, a 1-0 whitewashing of the Beefers in 12 innings that clinched the '16 second half title and overall 2016 championship.

Whatever 3b **Kyle Seager** (*left*) seemingly was at his best whenever he faced the Beefers in 2016.

In the first half, at the Beefer Bowl, Seager hit a ninth inning two-run HR off **Joaquin Benoit** to lift the Whats to a 7-5 win. In the same series, Seager hit an 11th inning HR off **Tony Watson** to give the Whats to a 5-4 victory. At home in Highland Park, Seager hit an 11th inning homer off **Brad Ziegler** to tie the game at three in a 4-3 Whatever win.

The beat went on in the second half as Seager homered in the first game of the Whats final series against the Beefs, a 5-3 Whatever win. Two games later, he doubled home a run, going 2-3, as the Whats won 4-3. Seager saved his best for last, slamming a game-winning homer off Ziegler (again) in the bottom of the 12th to clinch the second half and the 2016 championship for the Whatevers.

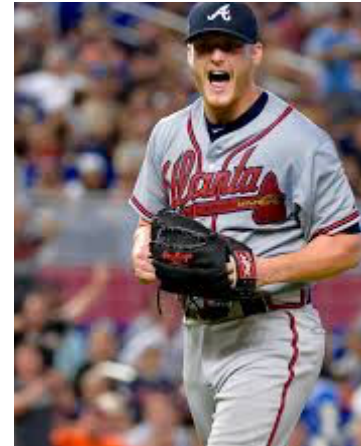
Early in the season the **Beefers** tagged **Devil** hurlers for 13 hits but lost the game 6-2. The **Tazzies** plated their six runs on seven hits, courtesy of three long balls.

Devils pitchers **Chris Archer** and **Javier Lopez** combined on a one-hit shutout over the **Beefers**. Archer carried a no-hitter into the ninth inning, but gave up a single to **D.J. LeMahieu** with one out in the ninth

The **Devils** and **Whatever**s took dueling shutouts into the 11th inning late in a second half game. The **Whats** won the game 2-1, in the bottom of the 11th when pinch hitter **Nori Aoki** singled home **Michael Brantley**.

As the **Whatever**s and **Devils** were wrapping up their seasons, the **Tazzies** won a 16-inning game, 6-5. Devils reserve infielder **Brock "Star" Holt** tripled to lead off the bottom of the 16th and scored on a squeeze by **Jose Altuve**.

The no-hitter thrown by the Road Warriors Shelby Miller (right) against the Taz Devils was the first ever no-hitter ever by a Road Warrior and first no-hitter in the league since 2013, when Cole Hamels, then with the Platoon, threw a no-hitter against the Whatevers in the first game of the 2013 World Series. There have been 19 no-hitters in the league's 29 years.

Beefery lefty **Dallas Keuchel** came within one out of a no-hitter against the Otters in the final series of the season for both teams. Keuchel's bid for a no-hit game was broken up by a single by **Todd Frazier** with two out in the ninth in a 1-0 Beefery win. **Gerrit Cole**, who only allowed four hits, was the loser. In the same

series, Beefery ace **Cole Hamels** also threw a complete game one-hitter, beating the Otters 2-0. The only Otter hit was by **Mike Trout** with one out in the seventh.

Beefery **Cole Hamels** ERA title in 2016 marked the second time he has had the best ERA in the league. In 1999, while a member of the Platoon II, Hamels 1.99 ERA led the league. Clay

Clayton Kershaw of the Devils nine wins tied him for the league lead with the Road Warriors **Jake Arrieta** for most wins. Kershaw was the top winner in the league in 2010 with a 12-3 record. Kershaw's 59 lifetime wins have him advancing on the OAPBA Top Ten lifetime winners.

Whatever **Zach Greinke**'s league-leading two complete games was the fewest in OAPBA history.

Whatever **Sam Dyson**'s league-leading 37 appearances were the most by an OAPBA reliever since 2011, when the Otters **Matt Belisle** appeared in 37 games.

Otter **Gerrit Cole** (left) led the league with nine losses, the first time the league's loss leader has not lost ten or more games since 1996, when **Jamie Navarro** and **Kevin Appier** of the Bombers both lost eight games.

Road Warrior **Bryce Harper**'s 57 walks were the most in the league since the Devils **Chase Utley** walked 60 times in 2010.

Road Warrior **Billy Hamilton**'s league-leading 27 stolen bases were the fewest for a league leader in SB since **Jose Reyes**, then with the Turfbeaters, led the league with 25 SB in 2006.

Freddie Freeman's league-leading .297 batting average was lowest batting average for a league leader in OAPBA's history. It was the first time the league's leading hitter has not hit .300 or better since 1994, when the Metros **John Olerud** hit .298.

Miller's no hitter was the first no-hitter in OAPBA since Cole Hamels, then with the Platoon, no-hit the Whatever's in the first game of the 2013 World Series. It was the 20th no-hitter in OAPBA history.

Tazzies Ryan Braun steals home in bottom of 17th to win grueling extra-inning contest

Taz Devils RF Ryan Braun shocked the Beefers Alex Wilson with a steal of home in the bottom of the 17th inning to give the Devils a 5-4 win in a game characterized by a variety of remarkable happenings.

The Beefers scored a pair in the first, but the Devils rebounded for two in the second when Braun homered and pitcher Chris Young, batting in the eighth slot in the lineup, singled home Lorenzo Cain, who had doubled. The Beefs again took the lead in the third on Justin Turner's fifth homer of the year, but the Devils Braun tied the game at 3-3 with an RBI double in the bottom of the inning.
