



Determined Otters battle their way to 2020 championship



Manager Jonathan Stillwell's Otters captured the 2020 crown in heroic fashion, coming from far behind in the second half, and then overcoming Craig Dolan's Tsunamis in a classic World Series in which all but one game was decided by either one run or a walk-off finish.

The 2020 championship was the third OAPBA title in the past five years for Jonathan, who entered in the league in 2011. Over the past five years, his Otters have compiled an enviable 184-137, .573 record.

The Otters featured a powerful offense that was led by a career season by 2b **Ketel Marte**, another outstanding year for longtime Otter 1b Freddie Freeman, an explosive year for young OF **Ronald Acuña**, and continued productivity from OAPBA great CF **Mike Trout**. On the mound, the Otters featured a solid one-two pitching staff led by starters

Stephen Strasburg and **Jacob deGrom** and closer **Kirby Yates**.

Runner up in 2020 was Craig Dolan's Asian Tsunamis, who won a tight first half race with an outstanding 27-13 record, but fell to 19-21 in the second half. The Tsunamis battled the Otters in a seven-game World Series that may be the most memorable in OAPBA's 33-year history, with the Otters prevailing thanks to a memorable eighth inning error by Tsunami CF Byron Buxton that led to the Otters winning 3-2 in Game Seven.

Whatever teams 3b **Alex Bregman** and starter **Zack Greinke** captured league honors for MVP and Cy Young winner in 2020. Otters ace closer **Kirby Yates** won Reliever of the Year honors.

Bregman came into his own in 2020, leading the league in hitting (.321), on-base percentage (.427) and slugging (.675), with 23 homers and driving in 60 runs, second in OAPBA.





Greinke enjoyed a fine season, leading the league in ERA (3.01), going 8-4. In twelve years in the league, the last nine with the Whatever's, Greinke has compiled a 70-49, 3.74 record.

Yates moved into the closer role for the Otters in 2020, saving 19 games, second in the league and earning Reliever of the Year honors for the second straight season. Over the past two seasons with the Otters, Yates has an ERA of 1.57 and 20 saves.

2020 marks OAPBA's 33rd season

The league's biggest news in 2020 was the addition of a sixth franchise; Tony Stevens' Golden Horde. The addition of Stevens team required some correspondent modifications in scheduling and drafting. As events unfolded, a significant change was required with the management of new franchise. After only eight games into the 2020 season, the franchise was taken away from Stevens and managed on a one-year interim basis by former Road Warrior skipper Marc Bostrom.

The league continued to maintain an 80-game schedule (two 40-game halves) with the winners of the two halves playing in the World Series (if a team won both halves, they captured the league title without a World Series). The trading period at the halfway point was retained. The addition of a sixth team meant that all series became four-game series, instead of five-game series.

2020 Rules Modifications

Rules modifications adopted during the 2020 Rules Meeting on Friday, 10 a.m., Nov. 29, 2019 at Johnson Wholesale Flooring in Orlando:

Stolen base attempts, with the exception of hit & run play, returned to using to using the SB ratings for each player as listed by APBA. In 2019, the league experimented with modifying the SB ratings to improve SB performances. This was repealed for the 2020 season.

Hit & Run rules were modified slightly as follows: "If a hit and run is called, with an eligible base runner, and a "13" is the result of the dice roll, the batter is credited with a strikeout and base runner has no penalty on the steal attempt. If the dice roll is "14", it is considered a pitch out, ball one, and the base runner loses 15 points from his steal number plus any adjustment for the pitcher's MF rating and the Catcher's Th rating."

Error randomizer: for the 2020 season, continuation of use of the 2019 error randomizer card.

RP bases empty modification: On rare play dice rolls with the bases empty, the rule was modified to read "If a "ball" is the result, it is considered ball two. If a strike or foul ball is the result, it will be considered to be two strikes."

Roster size rules were modified to read:

- Total **roster size increased to 35 players**.
- Thirty **(30) players to be designated as active** for each half.
- For each **half**, five (5) players were designated as "developmental" and are ineligible to participate in that team's games for that particular half. These players, however, will be eligible to be graduated or called up to the active roster at the end of the first half, with an equal number of players sent down to replace the graduated players.
- For each individual **series**, five active players were designated as "inactive" and will not be eligible to participate in that team's particular individual series.

J4 modification: Moves of non-J4 players (i.e. J1, J2, J3) were permitted at the halfway point (after 40 games). Managers were still able to maintain 30 players available for each series, with 25 being announced as active before the series.

2020 Draft rules modifications:

- For the 2020 draft, each of the six teams **drafted from the American League**. The draft order for the 2020 remained in reverse order of finish from the previous season, with the exception of the new franchise, the Horde, who drafted fifth, one place in front of the defending 2019 champion Tazmanian Devils.
- With the increase in roster size, the draft increased to **17 rounds**.
- After the 17th round, managers were permitted to remain in the draft by cutting a player and drafting another player, up to three additional players. In other words, managers could draft 20 players (with three correspondent cuts in the 18th through 20th rounds)

- Players cut during the additional rounds, were *not* permitted to be drafted by other teams.
- Once a team dropped out of the draft, that team was not allowed to re-enter.

Introduction of the **designated hitter**: A new DH rule was added, reading “The DH is at discretion of home team manager. The home manager must declare if the designated hitter will or will not be utilized in the home manager’s series.

J4 eligibility. Starting pitchers, with a J-4 injury rating, were allowed to be on the active roster (the 30 players eligible to play in a series) and *eligible to move from active to the five-player inactive grouping for each series*. A **J-4 pitcher**, however, was required to remain on the 30-player availability roster for the **entire season**

Pitcher categorization: Pitchers were broken into four different categories:

- Starter
- Reliever
- Closer
- Opener/Reliever
- A pitcher who is primarily a starting pitcher must follow current league rules for usage. The Opener/Reliever may start their limit of his pro-rated number of starts, up to his allowable batters faced. Opener/Relievers must rest one game before being used a reliever. There are no changes to pitchers who are relievers or closers

2020 World Series

*Otters win 2020 crown in dramatic seven-game Series;
Buxton's miscue in final game leads to Otters 4-3 win*


In what was the most competitive OAPBA World Series in league history, Jonathan Stilwell's Otters won their third league title in seven games, topping Craig Dolan's Tsunamis with the most unlikely World Series finish in OAPBA's 33-year history.

The entire Series was closely contested. Six of the seven games were determined in the final at bat, with three walk-off wins in the first four games. Home runs, which dominated play throughout OAPBA's regular season, were plentiful, but not totally the determining factor in the Series. The Otters went deep 10 times while the Tsunamis pounded out eight home runs.

The Tsunamis 7-1 win in Game Six was the only game of the series that did not go down to the wire.

And, in the finale, with Game Seven deadlocked at three runs apiece, an eighth-inning error by Tsunami Byron Buxton, led to the Otter run that proved to be the game-winner in a tight 4-3 win.

Game 1 Otters 6, Tsunamis 3 *Otter Jose Abreu hits 3R walk-off homer to win opener*

The home field Otters jumped out to an early lead when Christian Yelich homered with Trea Turner on board in the first inning. The Otters added another run in the 4th on a Freddie Freeman double. The Tsunamis, however, came back to tie the game with solo home runs by Corey Dickerson, Nolan Arenado and Anthony Rizzo in the sixth and seventh innings.

With the game tied at three apiece in the bottom of the ninth, Mike Trout and Ketel Marte reached base and Jose Abreu, in for Freeman, launched a three-run home run off Tsunamis reliever Will Harris to give the Otters a 6-3 walk off win and a 1-0 lead in the Series.

Game 2 Otters 2, Tsunamis 1 *Otters take 2-0 Series lead behind two-hitter by deGrom, Yates*

Game Two was dominated by Jacob deGrom (*right*), who threw eight strong innings with closer Kirby Yates finish the game to earn a save for a combined two-hitter. It was also Otter SS Trea Turner's moment to shine, using his speed and power to record both Otter runs

The Otters scored right off the bat when Turner walked to lead off the game, stole second and third and then came home on a sacrifice fly. The Asians answered in the second when Mark Canha doubled and scored on an RBI single by Nolan Arenado, tying the game at 1-1.

Tsunami starter Marco Gonzales and deGrom then settled down, but in the fifth, Turner got hold of a Gonzalez fastball and homered to give the Otters a 2-1 lead, which turned out to be all that deGrom needed, as he bore down to keep the Tsunamis off the board through the eighth, before giving way to Yates to finish the game.

Game 3 Tsunamis 6, Otters 5 (12) *Asians come from behind for extra-inning win*

The action shifted to the Tsunamis home field with the Otters sending Lance Lynn to face Michael Pineda.

The Otters drew first blood when Mike Trout homered to lead off the fourth. Trout's blast was followed by walk and three single, scoring two more runs and giving the Otters a 3-0 lead.

The Tsunamis immediately answered in the bottom of the inning when Dickerson hit his second home run of the series, with two men on base, to tie the game at three apiece.

In the seventh, with two out, the Otters strung together three walks and a single to score twice and grab a 5-2 lead. However, a clutch ninth-inning, two-out single from Tsunami CF Byron Buxton brought in two runs to tie up the game at five and force extra innings.

In the bottom of the 12th, the Tsunamis put together two doubles to win the game 6-5 and cut the Otters lead in the series to 2-1.

Byron Buxton and Corey Dickerson were the hitting stars for the Tsunamis - Buxton was 4-6 with three extra base hits while Dickerson had a crucial three run home run and an RBI double.

Game 4 Tsunamis 3, Otters 2 *Tsunamis's tie Series at two apiece on Dickerson RBI double in ninth*

The Otters took an early 2-0 lead on solo homers from Ketel Marte and Yasmani Grandal. In the fifth, the Asians tied the game with a two-run rally keyed by a double from C Mitch Garver.

The score remained deadlocked at two apiece into the bottom of the 9th, with the Asians bullpen holding the Otters hitless over the final five frames.

For the second straight game the Asians scored in the bottom of the final inning to win. Trevor Story tripled and then came home on a double by **Corey Dickerson** (*right*) to give the Tsunamis a hard-fought 3-2 victory and even the Series at two games each.

Game 5 Otters 3, Tsunamis 2 *Otters win in ninth on Trout's RBI triple; take 3-2 Series lead*

The Tsunamis scored first in Game Five, taking a 1-0 lead when Buxton led off the game with a single and came home on a Tim Anderson double. The lead changed hands in the fourth, however, when Freddie Freeman put the Otters ahead 2-1 with a two-run HR, but Tsunami 1b Anthony Rizzo homered in the bottom of the fifth to tie the game at 2-2

Both bullpens held firm through the eighth, with the Otters advancing runners into scoring position in the fifth, sixth, and seventh, but failing to score.

In the ninth, Otter Ronald Acuña led off with a single and, after the next two hitters were retired, Mike Trout tripled, scoring Acuña to put the Otters in front 3-2. Otters closer Kirby Yates then finished off the Tsunamis with a three and out bottom of the ninth to earn the save and put the Otters to within a game of the 2020 OAPBA championship.

Game 6 Tsunamis 7, Otters 1 *Otters win in ninth on Trout's RBI triple; take 3-2 Series lead*

Play now returned to the Otter's Frank Selee Field in Oshkosh with the Tsunamis Marco Gonzales and Otters Jacob deGrom matching up for the second time in the Series.

Otter Trea Turner led off the home first with a solo HR, but the Otter lead proved short-lived.

In top of the third the Asians began a strong assault. With two runners on base, Buxton homered to give the visiting Tsunamis a 3-1 lead. Mitch Garver increased the lead to 4-1 with a homer in the fourth and Trevor Story doubled home a run in the sixth to make it 5-1 Nolan Arenado launched a bomb in the eighth putting the game out of reach in what was the first one-sided game of the Series.

The Otters left 12 on base including eight runners in scoring position. The Tsunami win set the stage for a Game Seven, to decide the 2020 OAPBA championship.

Game 7 Otters 4, Tsunamis 3 *Buxton misplay in ninth gives Otters 2020 OAPBA crown*

With the Series tied at three game apiece, Game Seven was a second matchup of Micheal Pineda for the Tsunamis and Lance Lynn for the Otters.

The Asians drew first blood, scoring a pair of runs in the third on three singles and a sac fly. Otter Ronald Acuña quickly got a run back with a homer in the bottom of the inning to cut the lead to 2-1.

In the fifth Tsunami CF Byron Buxton singled, stole second and scored on a single by Luis Arraez to build the Tsunami lead to 3-1, where it remained until the seventh, when longtime Otter reliable Freddie Freeman got hold of a Will Harris offering to make it 3-2 in favor of the Asians.

In the bottom of the eighth the Otters Yasmani Grandal doubled and Ketel Marte singled home Manny Machado, running for Grandal, tying the game at 3-3.

What then followed is a play that will live in OAPBA all-time lore. With two-out and Marte aboard, Mike Trout lifted a fly ball to center field....*and Buxton misplayed it, allowing Marte to come around and score, putting the Otters in front 4-3.*



Buxton's error in the eighth inning enabled the Otters Ketel Marte to score from first base, giving the Otters a 4-3 lead.

The Otter then once again trotted out their ace closer Kirby Yates, who retired the Tsunamis to give the Otters the win and 2020 championship.


The 2020 OAPBA All Star team featured two players who earned All Star honors on the 2019 team and two players who regained All Star honors after a gap of several seasons.

Making their second appearance on the All Star team were Tsunami 1b **Anthony Rizzo** (2015 and 2020) and Devils LF **Michael Brantley** (2016 and 2020)

Returnees from the 2019 All Star team were Whatever RF **Charlie Blackmon**, who was the All Star CF in 2019, and Otters 2b **Ketel Marte**, who was the All-Star utilityman in 2019.

The Whatevers had four members of the All-Star team including Pitcher of the Year **Zack Grienke**, Blackmon, MVP **Alex Bregman**, and utilityman **Gio Urshela**. The Taz Devils also placed four on the All-Stars. Besides Brantley, three Devils earned first time All-Star selection: C **J.T. Realmuto**, SS **Xander Boagerts** and CF **Max Kepler**.

The two combatants in the 2020 World Series only placed a combined total of three players on the team. The champion Otters were represented by 2b **Ketel Marte** and relief ace **Kirby Yates**. The runner-up Tsunamis held down the first base position with Rizzo.



Otter infielder **Ketel Marte**, a 2019 All-Star as a utilityman, earned All-Star honors at 2b in 2020, hitting .316 and driving in 54 runs in the Otters championship year.



Devils LF **Michael Brantley** ranked third in league batting at **.307**. Brantley was obtained in what proved to be a disastrous deal for the Beefers, who sent Brantley and OF Michael Conforto to the Devils for SS Bo Bichette and OF Orlando Mercado, who was cut by the Beefs.





OAPBA team by team 2020

Otters 49-31, .61. First half 25-15, .625 -2 games. Second half 24-16, 600, +2 games.



Otters manager Jonathan Stilwell won his third OAPBA championship in 2020. In his 10 years on the league, Stilwell has a fine lifetime 418-381, .523 record.

The Otters rebounded from a 40-40 season to compile the best record in the league and capture the 2020 crown.

The Otters had an excellent first half, going 25-15, which ordinarily would have been enough for a half-season title, but fell two games short of the Craig Dolan's Tsunamis (27-13).

In the second half, the Otters won their opening two games against the Beefers, but then lost their next seven in a row. On the verge of falling out of the second half race, the Otters won six of their next seven to climb back to 8-8, .500. As the second half wound down and still unable to catch up to the Tsunamis, who had gotten off to another fast start, the Otters caught fire and reeled off 10 consecutive wins before dropping an 11-1 decision to the surging Whatever's, tying them for first place with the Whats. The Otters rebounded to win their final two games against the Whats 6-5, on a Freeman double and run in the eighth, and 4-0, behind Luis Castillo, earning them the second half title by a two-game margin.

The Furry Ones led the league in scoring (445 runs) and rolled out a fearsome offense, led by 2b **Ketel Marte** (.316, 54 RBIs), OF Ronald Acuña (.222, 23 HR, 59 RBIs), 1b **Freddie Freeman** (.239, 20 HR, 50 RBIs). The Otters also had a deep bench, including **Jose Abreu** (.4328, 5 HR, 17 RBIs), **Michael Tauchman** (.310) and **Yoaan Moncada** (8 HR, 24 RBIs) that gave no relief to opposing pitchers.

On the mound, the Otters had the best starting rotation in the league. Righthander **Stephen Strasburg** (9-6, 3.88) tied for the league lead in wins while **Jacob deGrom** (7-1, 4.20), lefty **Patrick Corbin** (7-3, 4.56) and **Lance Lynn** (7-6, 5.64) combined for 21 wins. **Luis Castillo** was 5-5, 3.08 with a pair of combined shutouts. In relief, **Kirby Yates** (2-2, 1.64) was second in the league with 17 saves.

Tsunamis 46-34, .575. First half 27-13, .675, +1 game. Second half 19-21, .550, -5 games.

If not for a misplayed fly ball by Bryon Buxton in Game Seven of the 2020 World Series, the Tsunamis might have been the 2020 OAPBA champions.

As it was, the Tsunamis still enjoyed an outstanding season, going 46-34, battling their way to the first half title in a tough battle with the Otters and Taz Devils.

In the second half, the Asians got off to a great 9-2 start and looked they would run away with the 2020 championship. After their fast start, the Tsunamis continued at a .500 pace for their next 18 games, giving them a solid 18-11 record with fifteen games remaining on the schedule.

The bottom then fell out, as the overworkedTsunami bullpen ran out of gas as the team lost eight in a row. The Asians snapped the losing streak in their final second half series with a 9-3 win over the Whats, giving them a 19-19 record with two games left. The Asians could not stop the slide, however, and they lost their final two games to the Whats, finishing at 19-21 for the second half.

The Tsunamis led the league in batting (.260) and hits (719) and fell only five runs short of leading OAPBA in scoring (440 runs). Leading the Tsunami offense was 3b **Nolan Arenado** (23 HR, 56 RBI), SS **Trevor Story** (16 HR, 35 RBI) and 1b **Anthony Rizzo** (37 RBI, 24 HBP and .407 OBP). **Luis Arraez**, who played about half the time, hit .326. The real strength of the Tsunami offense was a deep bench that included 3b **Justin Turner** (.367), C **Tom Murphy** (.338), OF **Corey Dickerson** (.326, 8 HR) and SS **Tim Anderson** (.295) and utilityman **Max Muncy** (.285, 11 HR, 30 RBI).



Tsunami skipper Craig Dolan came close to winning the 2020 OAPBA title. Since taking over the Tsunamis (nee Road Warriors) in 2019, Dolan has an 85-77, .531 record.

The Tsunami starting staff was mediocre, at best, with **Noah Syndergaard** (5-1, 5.81) and **Domingo German** (5-4, 4.55) the leading starters. The Tsunami bullpen, however, was the heart of the pitching staff with 10 relievers all seeing considerable action, led by **Evan Marshall** (6-1, 2.10, closer **Felipe Vazquez** (2.93, and middle men **Will Harris** (2.35), **Ryan Pressley** (2.48), and lefty **Zach Britton** (2.27) all combining to effectively suppress opposition hitters.

Tazmanian Devils 45-35, .563. First half 26-14, .650 -1 game. Second half 19-21, .475, - 5 games.



Devils manager Dave Larson just missed winning the first half title, finishing a game in back of the Tsunamis. The second half, however, was a different story as the Devils sank to 19-21, five games behind the Otters.

The 2020 season was like two completely different seasons for the Tazzies, one good and one not so good.

The Taz Devils made a great run at the first half title, getting off to an 8-2 start before losing three in a row to the lackluster Beefers, dropping to 8-5. The Devils then caught fire and won 11 of their next 13 to improve to 19-7 and move into contention for the first half crown. Three losses in a row to the Otters, however, set them back to 19-10, but once again, the Devils fought back, winning six of their next seven games to reach 23-11. With six games left, the Tazzies could only manage a 3-3 record, losing twice to the Tsunamis and their final game of the first half to the Otters, finishing 26-14, only a game out.

The Devils second half felt like it was over just after it began. The Tazmen split with the Beefers and Whatever's to open the half, but fell apart when a journey to the Otters in Altamonte Springs resulted in four straight losses, dropping the Devils to 4-8. Splits with the Tsunamis and Horde failed to make up any ground and the Devils remained mired at four games under .500 at 8-

12. The Devils completed the second half going 11-9 the rest of the way, but it was too little, too late, finishing 19-21, five games behind the charging Otters.

The Devils led the league in pitching (4.06 ERA) and strikeouts (818) with **Charlie Morton** (9-5, 3.32) and **Gerritt Cole** (8-3) both enjoying fine campaigns. Veteran **Clayton Kershaw**, in limited action, was 3-1, 4.30. The remainder of the staff fell short of expectations, as exemplified by **Madison Bumgarner** (1-2, .791) and **Jack Flaherty** (5-7, 4.90). In the bullpen, **Liam Hendricks** was outstanding (1-1, 2.20, league-leading 20 saves), even after a rough final outing of the season saw his ERA balloon. **Josh (Darth) Hader** (3.09) and hard-working **Craig Stammen** (3.14, 36 games) were also effective out of the pen.

Whatever's 39-41, .425,-10 games. 1st half 17-23, .425,-10 games. 2nd half 22-18, .550 -2 games

The Whatever's were the sneakiest team in the league in 2020. After a disappointing 17-23 record in the first half, the Whats crept past everyone but the Otters to finish in the runner-up position in the second half with a 22-18 record, finishing only two game in back of the Otters.

The Whats opened 2020 with a sweep at the Beefers ancient Beefer Bowl, but for the rest of the first half, it was rough going, with the Whats swept by the Tsunamis in their second series and, after a couple of wins against the Horde, losing six in a row. Later in the first half, the Whatever's lost seven of nine, but then fought back with a modest five-game win streak, but it was all for naught as they finished 17-23 for the first half.

For the second half, the Whatever's engineered their schedule to play their first 20 games on the road and their final 20 games at home, a strategy that almost worked. After a 10-10 start, all on the road, the Whats started their long homestand by winning three of four from the Horde. They then swept the Beefs to improve to 17-11. After losing three of four to the Devils to slide to 18-14, the Whats lost three of four to the Otters, dropping them 19-17, too far behind to catch up. They finished the second half by beating the slumping Tsunamis three out of four to finish 22-18.



Whatever's manager Walt Taylor almost sprung a second half upset, finishing second at 22-18, only two games out of first place and a trip to the World Series.

Whatever stalwart **Zack Greinke** (8-4, 3.01) was outstanding for the Whats, leading the league in ERA and serving as their ace, particularly in their second half run. **Jack Odorizzi** had a fine season (6-2, 3.88), but the rest of the starting staff was less than imposing. In the bullpen, **Hansel Robles** (3-0, 2.43, 8 saves) was joined by **Brandon Workman** (3.38, but a less than satisfying 3-8 record), **Pedro Baez** (2.70), and **Matt Barnes** (3.29).

At the plate, 3b **Alex Bregman** led OAPBA in batting (.326) while hitting 23 HRs and driving in 60 runs. SS **Francisco Lindor** (.284) hit well and was outstanding on defense. LF **Eddie Rosario** (.275, 13 HR) was a pleasant surprise and RF **Charlie Blackmon** (.291, 14 HR, 37 RBIs) hit consistently well throughout the season. 1b Yuli Gurriel drove in 40 runs.

Beefers 33-47, .413. First half 15-25, .375, .425, -12 games. Second half 18-22, .450, -6 games.



Rod Caborn's Beefers overhauled the roster in 2020, but failed to demonstrate any improvement, finishing 33-47 for the second consecutive season.

The 2020 season was Déjà vu all over again for the Beefers. They compiled the same record as 2019 and, despite a roster reconfiguration that aimed at improving defense, speed, and youth, nothing seems to make a difference.

The Beefers suffered a double whammy throughout the season, saddled with a starting pitching staff that served as a punching bag for the rest of the league and an offense that struck out too many times (711 Ks) while scoring only one more run than the last-place Horde. Hoping for increased power output in 2020, the Beefs instead hit only 121 home runs, dead last in the league.

Only 2b **D.J. LeMahieu** (.264, 78 hits, 37 RBIs) generated much of a relatively feeble offense. RF acquisition **Bryce Harper** (.237, .349) walked 39 times. SS **Marcus Semien**, the Beefs second round pick in the '20 draft, hit .246 and drove in 39 runs. C **Christian Vazquez** (13 HR) lead all league backstops in home runs, but hit only .217.

The Beefer pitching staff was disappointing. **Shane Bieber** (6-6, 4.81) was inconsistent. **Frankie Montas** (3-2, 4.03) in the second half, fell short of expectations. Max Scherzer continued to be a mystery, going 3-7, 4.96 while **Kyle (The Pile) Hendricks** was hit hard too frequently (4-6, 5.74). In the bullpen, **Adam Ottavino** (1.88), **Sergio Romo** (3-1, 2.02), **Yusmeiro Petit** (league-leading 40 appearances, 2.80 ERA) and closer **Emilio Pagan** (2.00) were effective, but were too often called upon to enter games when the Beefers were already well behind.

Horde 28-52-47, .413. First half 10-30, .250, -17 games. Second half 18-22, .450, -6 games.

The league's newest franchise, the Horde got off to a perilous start. Under rookie manager Tony Stevens, the Horde won their inaugural game, at home against the Tsunamis, 6-5. It was all downhill from there for the rest of the first half, losing three to the Tsunamis and then dropping three of four to the Beefers.



Longtime OAPBA manager Marc Bostrom rescued the expansion Horde franchise in 2020, piloting the team after the original franchise owner left the league after only eight games.

After only eight games, the franchise was taken over by the league as it became apparent that Stevens was less than eager to continue participating in the league. At that point, longtime manager **Marc Bostrom**, was kind enough to step in and guide the Horde through the rest of the 2020 season.

As expected from an expansion franchise, the Horde stumbled through a rocky start, undergoing a pair of nine-game losing streaks and finishing 10-30 for the first half.

In the second half, however, the Horde developing a personality as a spoiler, improving greatly, going 18-22, tying for fifth place with the Beefers, only six games out. The Horde was 6-4 after their first ten games of the second half before a five-game losing streak, drooping to 6-11 and putting an end to hopes of getting into contention. They rebounded to win five of their next nine to climb to 11-15 and won seven of their final 14 games to improve to 18-22 in the second half.

Despite a roster that was thin with quality talent, the Horde maintained interest all season, particularly with the performance of rookie 1b **Pete Alonso**, who hit 34 home runs, the most in the league since the Mambo Kings Gary Sheffield (40 HR in 2004) and drove in 62 runs. Alonso's wingman was 3b **Eugenio Suarez**, who, despite hitting only .182, slammed 21 homers and 41 RBIs. SS **Corey Seager** (.255, 13 HR) and CF **Alex Verdugo** (.259) also showed flashes.

The leader of a thin Horde pitching staff was lefty **Hyun-Ju Ryu** (5-6, 4.48). Southpaw **Eddie Rodriguez** (5-9, 6.49) had to stay in games much too long, lacking support from a thin Horde bullpen. **Marcus Stroman** (3-9, 5.62) suffered the same fate as Rodriguez. Among the Horde relievers, **Shane Greene** (2-1, 2.89, 13 saves) did well, as did **Alex Colome** (2.75), but the rest of the bullpen staff lacked appearances and was not able to lend any help to the starter.



2020 OAPBA Notes



The 2020 season took (eight months and 24 days or 267 days) to complete. The Beefers and Taz Devils launched the 2020 regular season on Leap Year Day, Saturday, Feb. 29. The season-ending 2020 World Series between the Tsunamis and Otters was staged on Saturday, Nov 21.

For the third straight season, no pitcher reached the 10-win mark. The last pitcher to achieve 10 wins was Zack Greinke in 2018, who was 10-4.

For the first time in OAPBA history, no qualified (80 or more IP) starting pitcher had an ERA below 3.00. The 2020 ERA leader was Zack Greinke, WhatEVERs, at 3.01.

Liam Hendricks, the 2020 saves leader, was the first saves leader to record 20 saves in a single season since 2014, when Taz Devils closer Mark Melancon, Devils

chalked up 21 saves

Bad news and good news. Beefeer starters had the league's worst ERA, 5.46 but the bullpen finished with a league best mark of 3.23

Rookie power. First year player Pete Alonso, Horde, totaled 34 home runs, the most in a single season since Gary Sheffield, Mambo Kings, in 2004.

Break out the icepack. Tsunami 1b Anthony Rizzo was struck by a league-leading 24 pitches in 2020, only two short of the league record of 26 HBP, set in 1999 by Green Monster C Jason Kendall.

Plunk and speed. Hard-throwing Devils ace **Gerritt Cole hit 10 batters**, only one shy of the hit batsmen record, jointly held by Mike Mussina, Highlanders in 2001 and Doug Davis, TurfbeatErs in 2005. Cole's 153 Ks were the most since CC Sabathia led the league in K's in 2009 with 161.

Reliability. The Otters pitching staff was the league's most consistent with an ERA of 4.44 and the bullpen, 4.01.

Call to the bullpen. The Tsunamis were challenged to compete with a poor starting staff, so they leaned heavily on the bullpen. The Asians used a league high 15 relievers, including an appearance by 1b Anthony Rizzo, totaling a league high 283 relief appearances. The rest of the league averaged 214 relief appearances.

Unsteady Eddie. Horde starter Eddie Rodriguez allowed 85 total runs and 74 earned runs, the most runs allowed since Jon Lester, Gashouse Gang, in 2012, who gave up 80 total runs, all earned. Rodriguez also led the league in hits allowed (118) and tied with teammate Marcus Stroman for the most losses (nine).

Special K's. Two OAPBA teams average one strikeout per inning on the season. The Devils racked up 818 strikeouts in 736.7 innings. The WhatEVERs fanned 727 batters in 717.7 innings.

Twenty-two pitchers who threw at least 30 innings fanned at least one batter per inning. The complete list:

Beefers 0	Closer Emilio Pagan fell just short of the 30 inning mark, but fanned at least one an inning.

Three pitchers fanned at least 12 batters per nine innings of work. Patrick Corbin of the Otters, 12.53 per nine. Gerrit Cole of the Devils, 12.48 per nine. Justin Verlander of the WhatEVERs, 12.39 per nine.

Devils reliever Josh Hader earned an honorable mention for averaging 14.44 strikeouts per nine innings, but pitched in just 23.7 innings.

Keeping it in the ball park. The starter who qualified for the ERA title and who had the fewest home runs allowed, was Luis Castillo of the Otters. He served up just nine long ones in 86 innings of work. Relievers Evan Marshall and Ken Giles of the Tsunamis gave up just one homer in a similar number of innings. Marshall, 30.0 and Giles, 30.7.

Out of control. The Beefers walked the most batters, giving up 268 freebies.

In control. The Tsunamis walked the fewest of any league pitching staffs with 237 BB.

Pitchers at the plate The Whatever's pitching staff earned the pitcher's silver slugger award. While they were second in average, (.136 to the Beefers .144 BA), they drove home 18 runs and had the only homers by pitchers on the season, tallying four. Devils pitchers got the Bamboo Bat award for the league worst hitting staff. They had three hits in 94 at bats for a .032 average, but they showed some patience at the plate, drawing the most walks with six.



Horde 1b Pete Alonso led the league in homers (34) and RBIs (62). His 34 homers were the most in OAPBA since Gary Sheffield of the Mambo Kings hit 40 homers in 2004.

Well hit. The Otters and Horde each had eight hitters with double figure home runs. Pete Alonso of the Horde blasted a league best 34 homers. Alonso's power was evident as 68 percent of his hits were for extra bases. Several players averaged at least 50 percent extra base hits. And, while he didn't qualify for the batting title, Mitch Garver of the Asians totaled 71 percent of his hits for extra bases, 22 of 31.

Robber barons. The Tsunamis led the league with 44 stolen bases while the Horde finished last with just four. The Otters were the most successful on the base paths, swiping 34 bases in 38 attempts, a success percentage of 89 percent.

Good eyes. The Otters worked opposing hurlers for the most bases on balls, 301. The free-swinging Horde had the fewest at 216.

Breezin' it. The Horde led the league with the most team whiffs, 759. The Devils had the fewest team strikeouts with 606.

Several players took it personally to let a pitch go by. Otter supersub

Jose Abreu had one walk with 11 strikeouts. Whatever Eddie Rosario walked one time with 33 whiffs. Teammate Whit Merrifield walked once with 19 strikeouts.

Gimme three. The Tsunamis Hunter Dozier is not known for his speed, but he legged out a league-best seven triples. The Otters had nine players each tally a three-bagger. The team that had the fourth most triples, the Devils, had ten players with at least one.

Turn on the power. Ronald Acuna Jr. of the Otters did not like running, except around the bases. He finished the year with five doubles, two triples, and 23 home runs. The Asians' Tim Anderson had just one home run, but totaled 17 doubles.

The Tsunamis belted six home runs in a game against the Horde during the season and posted five home runs in a game on three separate occasions.

Several players had more homers than doubles and triples. **Nolan Arenado** of the Tsunamis had 23 homers with 13 other extra base hits. The Horde had four such players. **Eugenio Suarez** powered out 21 homers with 12 more for extra bases. **Gary Sanchez** had eight homers against three doubles. **Michael Conforto** slugged 13 homers with just five doubles. Alonso totaled 44 extra-base hits, 34 homers with just ten other hits for extra bases.

The Devils had the league leader in doubles, **Cody Bellinger** with 25 two-baggers.. They also had four players finish with 20 or more two baggers. The other five teams either had one or two players totaling at least 20. The Tasmanian's led the league with 212 doubles while the Horde finished last with 125.

Strollin'. Only one player finished with more walks than strikeouts, **David Fletcher** of the Whatever's. In limited use, Fletch had 13 free passes with just two strikeouts. Other players who came close included Whatever teammate Alex Bregman 41 vs 43. Tsunamis Juan Soto, 51 vs 52 and Devil Mookie Betts, 52 vs 55.

Benchmasters. The Otters had the most productive bench, with five hitters, with at least 50 plate appearances, hitting over .300. Jose Abreu .438, Michael Tauchman .310, Manny Machado .327, Yoan Moncada .305, and Austin Meadows

.303. The Tsunamis had three outstanding bench players: Justin Turner .367, Tom Murphy .338, and Corey Dickerson .326.

At the other end of the spectrum, the Beefers had four batters, with at least 50 plate appearances, who hit under .200. The Horde had three.

Headed toward home. Mookie Betts of the Devils came closest to scoring one run per hit. Betts scored a league best 67 runs on 76 hits. He lead the league in walks with 52.

Otters utilityman **Eric Sogard** was the only position player to *not* score a run. He failed to cross the plate in 33 plate appearances.

Beefers mid-season acquisition **Luke Voit** hit pinch-hit home runs in the first two games of a Beefer home series against the Otters in the second half. Both went for naught with the Otters won 11-4 and 4-3 in 11 innings. Voit made it three straight games with a pinch-hit extra-base hit in Game Three, a double that capped a 4-1 Beefer win.

Whatever 1b **Yuli Gurriel** had a field day against the Beefers at the Beefer Bowl in the second half, homering in the first two games , both Whatever losses, and then slamming a **grand slam** in Game Three to lift the Whats to a 9-0 win.

Two is good. Three is better. The Horde stifled a potential Beefer rally in the third inning of a 4-3 Beefers win in the second half with a **triple play**. Horde 2b Gleyber Torres was in the middle of the fielding gem, catching a line drive by Christian Vazquez, tagging the runner at second base for the second out and then throwing to 1b Pete Alonso to nail the runner at first base.

The Tsunamis also posted a triple killing against the Otters. Mike Trout lined out to Tsunami 2b Luis Arraez, who tagged a baserunner at second base and threw to Anthony Rizzo to complete the triple play.

Streakers. Otter **Ronald Acuña** homered in four straight games in the second half, highlighted by leading a four-game sweep of the Asians with a home run in each of the four games. The Horde's **Gleyber Torres** homered in three straight games as the Horde split with the Whatevers in the second half. Tsu 2b **Luis Arraez** had a 12-game hitting streak in the second half.

OAPBA home run **Pete Alonso** hit four consecutive home runs over a two-game span in a pair of Horde losses at the Devil Dome in the Horde's final series of the 2020 season.

Devils great **Clayton Kershaw** was 3-1 in 2020 with 73 strikeouts. Kershaw moved into a tie for fourth-place in winning percentage (career 81-35, .698) with Dennis Martinez (37-16, .698). His 81 wins ranks sixth all-time in OAPBA, only one win behind **Pedro Martinez** (82 wins) and four behind **Tom Glavine** (86 wins). The league's all-time wins leader is **Greg Maddux** (122-92). With a good year in 2021, Kershaw is in position to move into a number of key OAPBA career pitching Top Ten categories.

In 2020, three active players moved into key categories for the league's Top Ten career batting leaders. Tsunami OF **Corey Dickerson's** lifetime .302 average jumped him into second place in all-time batting, second only to longtime OAPBA great **Joe Mauer** (.310). Whatever RF **Charlie Blackmon's** (right) .291 performance in 2020 improved his lifetime average to .286, fifth in all-time batting average. Tsunami **Anthony Rizzo**, who was already in the Top Ten for HBP, moved up to fifth on the all-time list, with a career 64 hit by pitches.



Otters SS **Trea Turner** tied with the Whats' Francisco Lindor for the league SB lead. Both players stole 14 bases. Turner turned on the jets in the 2020 World Series, stealing 8 bases, three in one game.

2020 Draft

Expansion draft, Nov. 26, 2019

New manager Tony Stevens drafted from two different sources to build his Golden Horde Franchise for their entry season in OAPBA in 2020.

First, Stevens was permitted to draft up to six players from players cut by each of the five existing franchises, a total pool of 90 players. Second, Stevens was permitted to draft from three National League franchises selecting four players from each of the three selected franchises, giving the franchise 18 rostered players going into the regular season draft.

Steven's expansion picks from the cut pool included:

3b Eugenio Suarez (from Taz Devils)
SP James Paxton (from Otters)
SP Zack Wheeler (from Tsunamis)

The three National League teams selected by Stevens for expansion talent were the Los Angeles Dodgers, the Atlanta Braves, and the New York Mets. His draft selections from the three NL teams included:

In summary, Stevens built an entire starting staff from his selections and filled four slots in his bullpen. To build his offense, he drafted sluggers Pete Alonso and 3b Eugenio Suarez, talented youngsters Corey Seager, Amed Rosario and OF J.D. Davis, and promising catcher Will Smith.

Regular season 2020 Draft, Feb. 22, 2020

The 2020 draft was once again staged at Johnson Wholesale Flooring in Orlando, but was held considerably later than previous years because of the entry of the league's new expansion team. The draft was held on Saturday, Feb. 22, *after* the 2019 cards were issued by APBA, which differed from recent past years, when the draft was held *before* the cards were issued.

Two major changes characterized the 2020 draft.

First, the league needed to accommodate the entry of Tony Stevens' Golden Horde as an expansion team and second, the draft was expanded to allow expansion of all team rosters to 35 players.

With the increase in roster sizes, the draft was increased from 15 rounds to 17 rounds, plus three additional rounds for cut and draft selections

After the 17th round, managers were permitted cut any of their 35 players, including those drafted, and draft up to three other players, which enabled each manager to draft up to 20 new players. Players cut in the three additional post-draft rounds could not be re-drafted by other franchises.

The first pick in the draft was starter Shane Bieber by the Beefers, who finished last in the league in 2019. Walt Taylor's Whatevers selected Jose Berrios with the second pick and Craig Dolan's Tsunamis drafted reliever Will Harris with the third pick. 2019 league runner-up Jonathan Stilwell went with starter Lance Lynn in the fourth slot and Tony Stevens, in his first official draft pick as an OAPBA manager, selected 2b Gleyber Torres. The league champions, Dave Larson's Taz Devils picked reliever Liam Hendriks.

Asians' Max Muncy sets new OAPBA record with 10 RBIs in a single game to lead lopsided rout

Craig Dolan's Asian Tsunamis (9-2, leading OAPBA) pounded out a 25-3 thrashing of the Horde (6-9) in Game Three of their series at the Horde.

Leading the way for the Asians was 2b **Max Muncy, who belted a pair of grand slam HRs, a first in OAPBA, along with a two-run single, totaling 10 RBIs, breaking** the league's previous record of nine RBIs in a single game, held previously by the Beefers Jermaine Dye and Otters Freddie Freeman.

The Tsunamis put this game away early scoring seven unearned runs on only two hits against Horde starter Marcus Stroman, who lost his eighth game in a row. The inning included four walks by Stroman, a hit batsman, and wo Horde errors. The Tsunamis kept it going in the second inning, tallying five times, four runs via Muncy's first grand slam of the game, to build their lead to 12-0.

The Horde fought back in the bottom of the second with a three-run HR by Jorge Soler off Tsunami starter Noah Syndergaard, but from that point forward, it was all downhill for the Horde. The Tsunamis scored three in the fourth, added two more on a two-run double by Tim Anderson in the fifth, and tacked on six more in the sixth inning, highlighted by Muncy's second grand slam of the game, off Horde reliever Sean Newcomb, making the score 23-3.

Newcomb remained in the game for the Horde for the final three innings, give up two more runs in the ninth on a two-run single by Anthony Rizzo.

Altogether, the Tsunamis totaled 20 hits and were helped by wildness on the part of the Horde pitching staff, who yielded 12 bases on balls.

Syndergaard stayed in the game long enough to earn the win, but was ejected in the sixth after hitting Horde 3b Eugenio Suarez, his third hit batsman in the game. Tsunami 1b **Anthony Rizzo was hit four times by Tsunami pitchers**, twice by Stroman, setting a new league record for HBP in a single game, breaking the previous record by Kenji Jojima.
