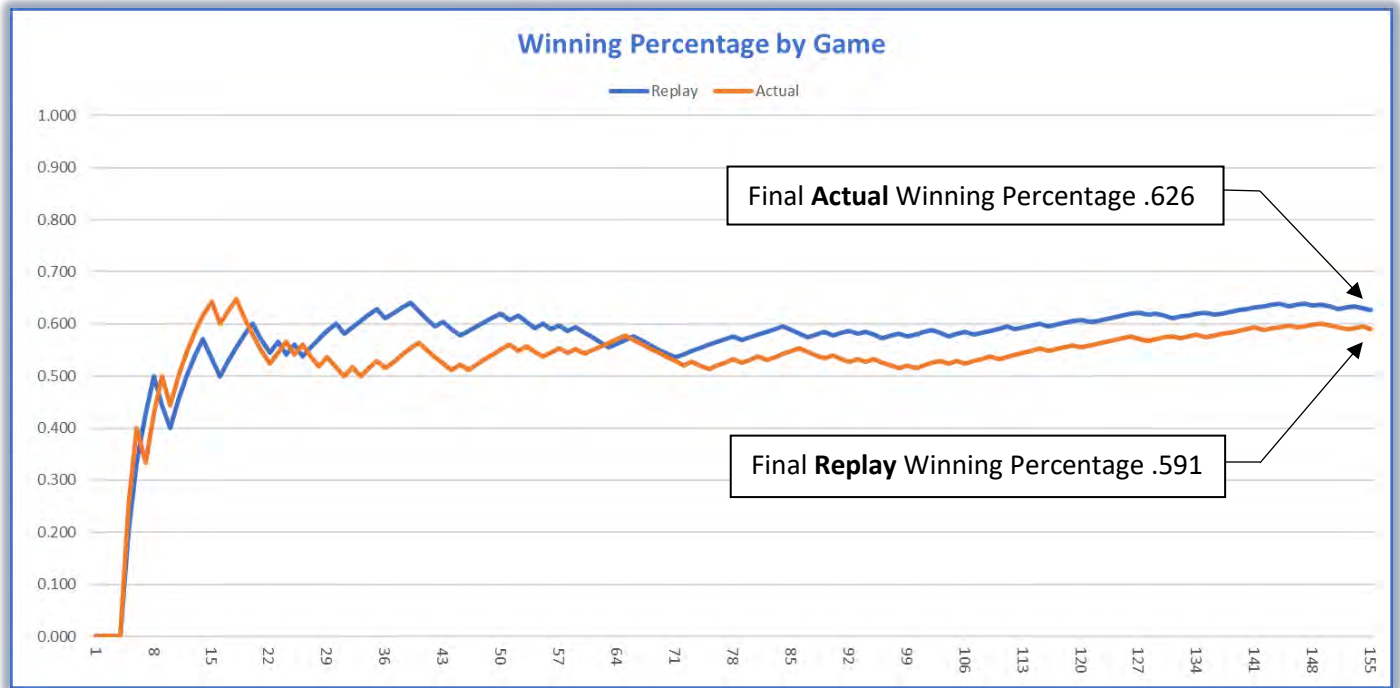
The Philadelphia Athletics finished with ninety-seven (97) wins in the replay, six (6) more than actual play. Actual game number three (3) was declared a tie and called after 10 innings due to darkness. In the replay, the A's played all teams within 3 games of their actual head-to-head records. The A's were most successful versus Boston and St. Louis and least successful versus New York in both the replay and actual play.

In the replay, One Run Games and Blowouts mirrored actual play quite closely. Fifty-nine percent (59%) of the individual games matched the actual win/loss outcome.

Season at a Glance

After 65 games, the Athletics posted thirty-seven (37) wins in the replay and in actual play.

A's team batting average was .309 in the replay versus .304 in actual play. A's team ERA was 4.00 in the replay versus 3.97 in actual play.

Simmons' powerful hitting was achieved despite his unusual batting stance. A right-handed hitter and thrower, Simmons stood at the plate with his left (front) foot pointed toward third base, "in the bucket" in baseball parlance. Accordingly, he gained the nickname Bucketfoot Al, which he resented. Theoretically, he should have had difficulty in hitting outside pitches solidly. But Simmons overcame this apparent weakness by using an unusually long bat and moving his left foot closer to home plate with the approach of an outside pitch.

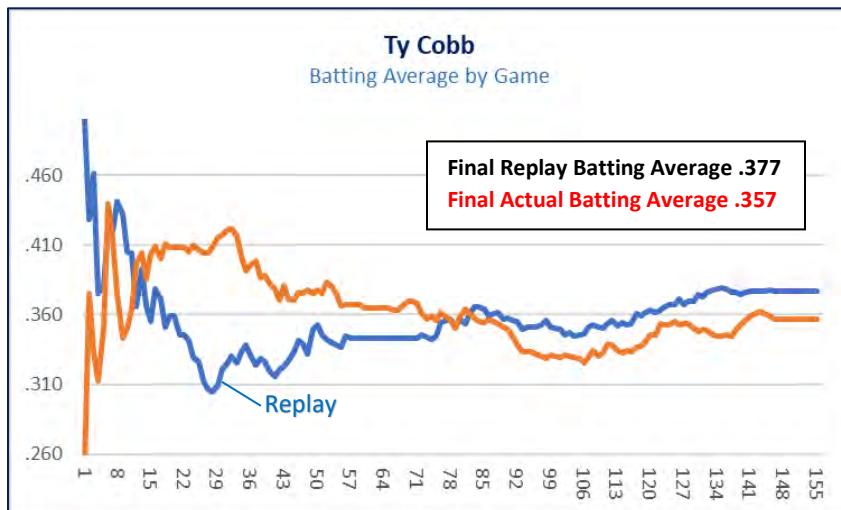

Modified game boards were utilized. The boards were modified from boards courtesy of the O.Z. League which were subsequently modified from the Marino Boards. My replay boards used Master Game pitching grades and designations, L/R pitcher splits and advanced fielding. Also incorporated an Error Card to reduce the number of errors.

Starting lineups were derived from Baseball-reference.com and transferred into Excel scoresheets.

Plate appearances and sacrifice hits for batters and innings pitched, complete games and saves for pitchers were monitored throughout the season to best manage for accuracy.

Opponent pitchers were utilized in the same number of innings as in the actual season.
