


Tommy Holmes, Indianapolis Aces

Introduction

The wars in Europe and the Pacific raged on in 1944, claiming more ballplayers who gave up one uniform for another. With the 1943 season in the rear-view, the project moved to 1944. The cards were swapped and new players joined the league and we were off and running. Neither Omaha nor Fort Smith fared well with key players in the service, and new rookies emerged to lead other teams to the top of the two divisions.

Providence got off to a great start and claimed the Northern Division pennant in plenty of time to rest up for the Series, but it was a different story in the South; going into the final round of games, four teams still had a chance for post-season glory. Columbus held a decent lead, but couldn't manage more than one win against defending champion Omaha; Martinsburg and Indianapolis split their final four, elminating both. But Louisville dominated Providence, resulting in a tie with the Cougars; then they won the one-game playoff; then, after a Game 1 loss, they won four straight from the team with the league's best record, including two complete-game victories by Dizzy Trout. The winning run scored in the bottom of the ninth in Game 5 on a two-base error by Irv Hall.

What's in store this year? In order to accommodate the many part-timers and players in the military, rosters have been adjusted for the upcoming 1945 campaign. Teams will be able to retain three military reserves as well as two additional uncarded players after the protection draft. Some of the regular players in the upcoming season won't be seen again when the regulars come marching home.

It'll be an adventure.

Buffalo Chargers



There was certainly some talent over in Buffalo, but not enough either on the mound or at bat. Bobby Doerr was once again a team leader, with 7 homers and 14 doubles, hitting .268/.479/.340. Whitey Kurowski delivered 15 doubles, and Augie Galan led the team with 17. They led the league in walks, but were in the middle offensively, which helped lead to their lackluster 30-32 finish.

On the mound, Rip Sewell (8-0, 3.01, 5 CG) was the best in the rotation overall, but Johnny Niggeling (6-3, 3.04, 5 CG) was a solid contributor. George Munger was relegated to the closer role, and he notched 11 saves and a 2.01 ERA - but didn't get into enough key situations to really make a difference. They've added arms and power in the draft, and should be more competitive in 1945.

Young player-manager Lou Boudreau did everything he could to get his club to the World Series. He hit 20 doubles and slashed .340/.451/.391, losing the batting title by 3/100 of a point. George McQuinn had 18 doubles and walked 30 times, leading to a .397/.447/.382 slash line. Doc Cramer hit .314, Oris Hockett .312. But that was largely it; Johnny Barrett had 10 triples and 6 steals, but hit an anemic .197. George Kell hit .217 with little power.

On the mound, the absence of Spud Chandler was sorely felt, but Hal Newhouser was overpowering – 11-1, 2.41, with a league-leading 133 strikeouts. Max Butcher went 7-5, 2.26, striking out almost no one. The bullpen was irregular: Freddy Schmidt recorded an 0.90 ERA, and Jake Wade was at 2.04, but Bill Fleming was at 4.57 despite his 9 saves. Ultimately, though, the last-game loss to charging Louisville was the most significant aspect of the 1944 season.

A second hard campaign up north was made worse by the absence of power threat Charlie Keller. There were no real strong hitters, and the team delivered a .224 average, last in the league. Phil Weintraub (.248/.448/.351) turned in an adequate rookie season; Ken Keltner had some power (18 doubles, 6 triples) but no one hit more than 5 homers.

On the mound, they were in the middle of the pack; rookie Preacher Roe (4-3, 7 saves, 2.66) spent time as the closer, but also made 8 starts. Mort Cooper (4-5, 2.91) and Bobo Newsom (6-6, 3.03) were workhorses, but the other starters were just awful.

The prospects for 1945 are modest. Joe Medwick has arrived to shore up the lineup, and Charlie Keller is back – but the team faces many of the same challenges. Will there be a new venue for '46?

The prospects are somewhat better for 1945, with a solid draft and improved pitching. The question is whether they'll have enough to contend again.

Snuffy Stirnweiss was great in the leadoff spot, slashing .272/.389/.358; Bob Elliott had 18 doubles and 7 triples and hit .313, while Tommy Holmes won the batting title by millimeters. Frank McCormick hit .264, and with Holmes tied for the team lead in homers with 6. The pitching was very good: Harry Brecheen went 7-0, 1.95; Walt Dubiel 5-3, 2.95; and rookie Jack Kramer 6-5, 2.57 – he started the All-Star Game, but had some trouble in the second half. The 1945 team should have a better shot at contention.

They finished strong, as described in subsequent pages. At the end they were fourth in hitting, second in pitching, and got contributions throughout the lineup. In an era with little power, they had two players with 10 homers. Emil Verban was offensively weak at the top of the order, but was a steady hand at second base; and Tony Lupien (.311/.452/.369, 8 triples) and Pinky Higgins (.284/.389/.362, 6 triples) were key contributors. On the mound they really shined. Dizzy Trout (12-4, 14 CG, 2.30) won the key playoff game and two in the Series; Fritz Ostermueller (6-2, 2.51) and rookie Steve Gromek (6-2, 2.62) were also excellent. They beat Columbus, then they beat Providence, and now the championship is theirs to defend.

Martinsburg Mountaineers



They were never really out of it all season, even to the final series. The difference between going to the World Series and going home for the winter was a matter of three or four games, and you never know when you're in the thick of it whether any win or loss has deep meaning.

Martinsburg was scrappy, taking after their manager Leo the Lip. Ralph Hodgin (.335/.470/.363) seemed to be on base all the time, driven in frequently by Dixie Walker (.324/.471/.390), Phil Cavaretta (.293) and Johnny Lindell (.290, 20 doubles, 7 triples). They'll be scrappy again in '45. On paper they're not the best, but they'll still be scrappy.

Stan Spence (.303/.554/.361) led the league with 11 homers and had 17 doubles; Irv Hall hit .285 with 12 doubles in the number two spot in the batting order; Bob Swift hit a surprising .300 in part time duty.

On the mound Hank Wyse (8-4, 3.26) led the starters, and Tommy de la Cruz (7-1, 1.52, 3 saves) was surprisingly solid. Hank Borowy had 5 wins and a 3.27 ERA, and Ted Wilks won 5 and saved 5 splitting time between starting and relieving.

This was a team that had everything go right . . . right up to the end, when it didn't go right in the World Series. Now they have to start at 0-0, without Stan Musial in '45. The pitching will be excellent, but will it be enough?

Buffalo's Whitey Kurowski was the MVP, driving in the first and fourth runs for his club.

Baseball in 1944

THE GAME

What was true in 1943 was even more true in 1944, and in general averages were down and doubles and triples were far in excess of home runs. Many teams had regulars with one or two power numbers, and most bullpens were stocked with starters not good enough to make the rotation. Given the relative pitching weakness overall, the starting pitcher often went four or five innings before departing for a pinch-hitter, or tried to "tough it out" with a two or three run lead late in the game (as the relief corps wasn't much better, if at all). Benches were also thin, as more players had only partial seasons, and the pinch-hitting choices didn't offer a lot of variety. With speed less common, there weren't a lot of pinch-running options either.

The absence of even more stars from major league rosters will allow a good number of players to be active whose careers will attend when the regulars come marching home.

MILITARY RESERVES

In order to preserve some sort of continuity, the teams will have the ability to retain three players who enter the military in 1945. These players will be held for the upcoming season:

In addition, each team will be permitted to carry two non-carded players above the 30-card limit. These are subject to the protection draft, and consist largely of players who didn't appear in 1945 but are carded in 1946 (most often due to military service). With the protection draft cut to 15, there should be a lot of roster movement, especially when we reach 1946 when it will be much deeper.

Sudden Death

At the All-Star Break, it looked like it was going to be quite a race in the Southern Division, conspicuously without last year's division winner Fort Smith, which was without several key players that had helped them succeed in 1943. It also looked like it wasn't going to be a year for the Louisville Colonels and their manager, "Kentucky Colonel" Earle Combs. They were just below .500, three games behind both Columbus and Indianapolis.

But it's a marathon, not a sprint, and while Indianapolis began to fall away, Louisville began to win. Dizzy Trout was phenomenal, finishing almost every game he started, while the middle of the order – Mel Ott and Bill Nicholson – got on base and hit homers, rare in wartime. By the two-thirds mark they were above .500, but Columbus was still winning as well, just not at quite the same rate. Heading into the final weeks of the season, Louisville had closed to just two games behind, and on the last weekend, four teams still had a chance. Martinsburg and Indianapolis were far enough out that one of the two had to sweep and then get extremely lucky. It was still Columbus' pennant to win or lose.

Louisville had the toughest road: they had three games against Providence, which had clinched its pennant days earlier. But magic came to Parkway Field: while Columbus dropped two of three to defending champ Omaha, far out of contention, Louisville made mincemeat of the best team in the league, scoring 23 runs in three games. With the other two teams splitting and out of contention, it all came down to one playoff game between two teams – Columbus, which had been in control for most of the second half, and Louisville, which had come out of nowhere.

Columbus got off to a quick start, scoring three times against Louisville ace Dizzy Trout. The Colonels answered with three of their own in the bottom of the second, including an RBI single by Trout himself. Columbus answered with a run in the third, further damage prevented by an ill-timed steal attempt by George Kell, erased by a strong throw by Walker Cooper. In the fifth, Bill Nicholson hit a blast over the left-field fence, and the Colonels added one more run in the eighth off Prince Hal Newhouser, working in relief. Dizzy Trout, meanwhile, gave up baserunners in the fifth, sixth and seventh, but did not surrender another run, retiring the last six including a final strikeout of Johnny Barrett to send Louisville to the Series.

Asked afterward why he didn't take Trout out of the game, manager Combs replied, "he didn't look tired to me."

The World Series

Providence recorded the most wins in the league with 37, erasing the disappointment from 1943, and punched its ticket to the Series well in advance of the climactic showdown between Louisville and Columbus (see above). Dizzy Trout's gritty performance made him unavailable for Game 1, and the fans at Cranston Field thought they were in the driver's seat. But baseball is a game of momentum, and Louisville had it in spades. After a Game 1 defeat when a rally fell just short, they took control of the Series and never looked back.

Providence got off to a quick start, scoring a run in the second inning and then four runs in the third, capped by a Phil Masi double. Rookie Steve Gromek hung in for two more innings, leaving for a pinch-hitter in the top of the sixth; Paul O'Dea's RBI single helped bring the game to 503. Hank Wyse gave way to a reliever, who shut the door, but Lefty Lee gave up another run in the eighth to bring the game to 5-4. Ted Wilks shut them down to bring home the victory

Louisville's sluggers, meanwhile, were making quick work of Hank Borowy. Pinky Higgins hit a solo homer in the second to make the score 2-0, and Mel Ott delivered a three-run bomb in the fifth. Walker Cooper homered in the 7th off Frank Barrett, and Trout himself took Barrett deep for a two-run homer in the 8th to ice it.

Returning home after a split, the Colonels faced the Mexican hard thrower Tommy De la Cruz, who had gone 7-1, 1.52 during the regular season. They only managed one run against him, Tony Lupien driving home Pete Coscarart who had tripled. In the seventh, Ott tried to score a second run, but was gunned down by Stan Musial. With a slim 1-0 deficit, Frisch pinch-hit for his ace; after Webber threw a shutout inning, Lee went to pieces in the 8th, giving up four runs. Ostermueller was masterful, putting Louisville ahead in the Series 2 games to 1 on his seven-hit shutout.

Wyse and the bullpen – Ewald Pyle and Ted Wilks – surrendered four more runs; meanwhile the wind was blowing out at Parkway Field, as Babe Dahlgren and pinch-hitter Dick Wakefield both homered – but it wasn't enough, and Louisville went up three games to one.

With everything on the line, Borowy faced Trout again, and this time both pitchers were on their game. Providence scored a run in the fifth on a Bob Swift double. Borowy held the slim 1-0 lead until the eighth, when a Walker Cooper double tied it up. With Borowy pitching well, he remained in the game into the ninth. He walked Mel Ott to lead off the inning, and he was retired on a fielder's choice by Pinky Higgins. Off with the pitch, he reached second base on a grounder to Irv Hall. Frisch decided he'd rather pitch to Coscarart than Trout; Borowy promptly induced another ground ball to Hall – but this one went through his legs and dribbled into center field. The slow-footed Higgins never stopped running, and when he scored the winning run, pandemonium erupted at Parkway Field, making Louisville the 1944 champs.
